Nursery: *This week in Nursery, the children have been busy creating a surprise and learning a song for Mother's Day. Please ask them to sing their special Mother's Day song on Sunday. They listened to different stories about mummies including 'My Mum is Fantastic' by Nick Butterworth. It was incredibly special to hear the children share all the wonderful things their mummies do to help them, and how much they cherish the special hugs and kisses you give them.*

The children have thoroughly enjoyed celebrating World Book Day, listening to a range of stories, making bookmarks, and creating their own books. They have had a fantastic time in the Giles library role play area, being a librarian, keeping the books tidy and using the computer to run the library. Amari said, "I'm using the computer, I'm working at the library." Jamie sat on the big comfy cushions and said, "It's story time!"

In phonics, the children have consolidated their knowledge of rhyme and practised making rhyming strings. As a class, the children created the rhyming string 'cat', 'mat', 'sat', 'rat', 'bat', 'hat', 'flat'. They then made the rhyming string 'sun', 'fun', 'run', 'bun'. Well done, Ladybirds!

Next week in PSED, the children will sort healthy and unhealthy foods. We will be reading 'The Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle, learning about the life cycle of a butterfly and practising the days of the week.

Reception: *This week the children have thoroughly enjoyed participating in activities linked to World Book Day. Some of the stories the children in Reception have listened to are 'The Enormous Turnip', 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears', 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. On Thursday morning, the children were all eager to see each other's costumes. Zoe in Tawny Owl class said, "I am Mirabel in Casita!"*

There has been a such a wide range of activities for the children to enjoy this week. Some of the activities were using cubes to measure the height of different sized beanstalks, making bowls of porridge for the three bears, and watching a 'balloon turnip' grow. Luca in Barn Owl class was so fascinated by the 'balloon turnip' experiment, he asked if the experiment could be put on a shelf so that he "could see if the balloon turnip carried on growing."

In mathematics, the children have continued to focus on number bonds totalling ten. They loved the activity of separating ten bears into two groups and writing a calculation to match. The children have used Numicon to help them create number bonds totalling ten and recorded their calculations on a whiteboard.

In RE, the children recalled the daily events of the Christian creation story. They listened to 'The Creation of the World' by Hector Perez and took turns to talk about all the natural things Christians believe God created.

In PSED, the children discussed the importance of exercise and what happens to their bodies after they have been moving about. Maeesha in Snowy Owl class said, "My heart is jumping faster!"

Next week, the children will focus on how to be a safe pedestrian and in literacy, they will design a road safety poster and add a caption. In mathematics, the children will be looking at doubles to ten. In RE, the children will be acting out the poem 'The Creation' by James Weldon Johnson and looking at paintings by famous artists.

Year 1: *What a fabulous day the children had yesterday celebrating World Book Day! They enjoyed listening to a range of stories and shared experiences of their favourite*

books. The children enjoyed showing their costumes to each other. Thank you for all your wonderful outfits. The children had an absolutely super experience.

This week in English, the children have begun their new topic on fairy tales. They shared their knowledge about fairy tales and created posters displaying their ideas. The children generated fairy tale vocabulary such as 'king', 'queen', 'castle', 'throne', 'magic', 'wand' and lots more! They enjoyed choosing objects from a feely bag and guessing which fairy tale the items could belong to. The children listened to the fairy tale 'Cinderella' and created a story mountain to retell the story with pictures and keywords.

Phonics this week has continued with alternative pronunciations. The children have revisited the grapheme 'ou', making the /ow/ sound heard in 'out' and 'shout' They have learnt that there are three further alternative sounds: /oa/ like in 'boulder', long /oo/ like in 'group' and short /oo/ like in 'could'. They have learnt the mnemonic 'oh you lucky duck' to support them in remembering the spellings for 'could', 'would' and 'should'.

Our Book of the Week was 'Peace at Last' by Jill Murphy. The hour was late and Mr Bear was tired. But he could not sleep, however he tried and wherever he tried. Snore, snore went Mrs Bear. Tick-tock, tick-tock went the clock. Would Mr Bear ever get to sleep? Please click the link if you would like to listen at home and find out what happens. [Peace at Last](#)

In mathematics, the children have continued their topic on place value. They have revisited their number bonds to ten and learnt that numbers from 11 to 19 are made from one ten and 'some more'. They have used a range of manipulatives such as tens frames, Cuisenaire rods and Numicon to show different ways to make these numbers.

In science, the children continued with their learning on materials. They investigated a range of objects, drawing them and labelling the materials used to make them. The children looked closely at objects made of wood, plastic, metal, glass and rock. The children also discussed why materials are suited for different purposes.

In computing, the children have enjoyed the next maze explorer challenge using 2Go on Purple Mash. They have navigated a route, inputting the coding needed to complete the journey.

In geography, the children have explored Stevenage using Google Earth. They have looked at different landmarks such as Fairlands Valley Lakes, the Gordon Craig Theatre and our school. The children have found the old and new town of Stevenage on a map and plotted our school, the theatre and Fairlands Valley Lakes.

Next week in English, the children will be continuing their fairy tale work and planning an alternative ending to Cinderella. In mathematics, the children will be continuing with their place value learning with numbers up to 20.

We hope you have a lovely weekend and a wonderful Mother's Day if you are celebrating it.

Year 2: It has been a fabulous week in Year 2. There were so many wonderful outfits on display on Thursday for World Book Day. The children were so excited to see each other's costumes and the adults were incredibly impressed! Thank you to everyone who made a donation to support the NSPCC and thank you all for your support to make the day so special. The children had a fantastic day, making bookmarks, taking part in a story quiz, enjoying a book scavenger hunt and designing their own special library.

In English this week, the children conducted research about the lives of the indigenous people of America. They focused on finding out about weapons, footwear, dreamcatchers, buffalo, food and totem poles. The children used what they learnt about effective searching in computing last half term to help them source the most useful web pages to find information. They remembered that asking a question on a search engine will bring up the most specific information and used this to make notes, in preparation for writing their own non-fiction book next week.

In mathematics, the children continued to learn about money. They explored how different coins can be used to make the same amount, focusing on £1. They learnt how to add and subtract money and practised these skills with different amounts and denominations.

In history, the children learnt about the hierarchy in the tribes of the indigenous people of America and made a headdress for a clan member. In PSCHCE, the children thought about how it feels when we are relaxed compared to when we are stressed and learnt some ways to help them relax.

In English next week, the children will use their research to write their own non-fiction book about the indigenous people of America. In mathematics, the children will begin a new unit of work focusing on multiplication and division.

In computing, the children will learn how to make a quiz using different types of questions. In geography, they will learn the four points of a compass and use compass directions to describe how to move around a map. In PSHCE, the children will learn how medicines work and important it is to use them safely. In art and design, the children will use natural objects to print patterns on to clay tiles and in science, they will revise what a seed needs to grow before planting their own.

Next Thursday 14th March, the Year 2 teachers will be hosting mathematics workshops. These will take place straight after school in the Year 2 classrooms. The workshops will focus on how we teach place value, addition and subtraction and how this lays the groundwork for children to develop their mathematic skills in junior school. You will also have an opportunity to see the resources and presentations we use to support our mathematics teaching. The workshops will be very informative and we look forward to seeing you all there.
