Nursery: *This week the children have been practising singing Christmas songs ready for their special concerts. They were all fantastic in their Christmas concerts and we are so proud of them all! We hope you enjoyed it as much as we all did.*

The children have enjoyed making some lovely Christmas cards for you this week and these will be inside their special folder with their wonderful work from this term. They have also enjoyed sharing a variety of Christmas stories and thinking again about the

Nativity story. Marnie shared, "We have a Christmas tree at home, it has a star and baubles."

The children have continued to enjoy playing in Santa's workshop this week, busily wrapping presents, and making cards for their friends and family. Evie commented, "I'm making a present for Santa, I need to put a tag on." Aden was busy writing a card and said, "It's for my mummy and I give her a cuddle every day."

The children are all looking forward to the Christmas party on the afternoon of Tuesday 19th December as there is no morning Nursery. Please can everyone arrive in party clothes at 12.30pm; we kindly ask that you take your child's coat home with you, they will not need to change their shoes.

***Reception:** This week the children have listened to many stories linked to Christmas and have enjoyed participating in a range of activities linked to the festive season. Some of the activities were coiling strips of paper to represent Santa's beard, using pasta to decorate a bell, and making reindeer food with porridge oats and glitter. The children have loved singing Christmas songs such as 'Jingle Bells', 'When Santa Got Stuck Up the Chimney' and 'Five Mince Pies in the Baker's Shop.'*

In mathematics, the children used 2D shapes to fill a Christmas tree template. They placed the shapes carefully ensuring the shapes did not go over the lines. As they were placing the shapes the children chatted about the shapes they were using, and it was great to hear them using mathematical vocabulary to describe the properties of the shapes. The children had lots of fun creating repeating patterns using Christmas decorations and other colourful resources. James in Snowy Owl class said, "I made a pattern with baubles." They enjoyed the challenge of working out which shape came next on the pattern train (www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/shape-patterns)

This week's poem of the week is 'Winter Poem' by Dorothy Aldis.

*The street cars are like frosted cakes,
All covered up with cold snowflakes.
The horses' hoofs crunch on the street;
Their eyelashes are white with sleet.
And everywhere the people go,
With faces tickled by the snow.*

Please encourage your child to read the poem to a member of your family. These weekly poems are to aid your child's fluency in reading. The children really enjoy learning the poems each week.

The Musician of the Month for December has been the composer George Frideric Handel. The children found out facts, such as Handel was born in Germany and when he was an adult, he was the Kapellmeister (the official composer) for George I, King of England. There is a story that King George I was so emotional when he heard one piece of music, that he stood up, and if the King stood up, this meant everyone else had to stand up as well! When watching the choir of King's College, the children noticed a musician playing an instrument similar to a trumpet. The staff looked up on Google and discovered this musical instrument was called a natural trumpet. Handel's 'Hallelujah' can be found using this link:

On Tuesday, the children will be celebrating Christmas by having a party. They can wear their Christmas party clothes and will need to bring in a small bag of party food with a drink. If your child has a packed lunch, the bag of party food needs to be

separate from their packed lunch. Please can all party bags have your child's name written on as in each Reception class there are children with food allergies.

Next term, the children will focus on science investigations and food technology linked to a traditional tale, and how a character can travel safely when on a journey.

Stay and Read will begin again on Friday 12th January.

All the staff and children in Reception would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

Year 1: In English this week, the children learnt and recited the poem 'Peppermint Stick' by an unknown poet. They practised and performed it to their peers, and to Mrs Mendel, to develop reading fluency and performance skills. The children also enjoyed making their own 'Peppermint Stick' calendars.

In phonics, the children continued to learn about the split vowel digraphs. They consolidated their knowledge of /a-e/, /e-e/, /i-e/, /o-e/ and /u-e/ and segmented and blended words such as 'cake', 'even', 'time', 'tone' and 'cube'.

Our Book of the Week has been 'The Smartest Giant in Town' by Julia Donaldson. George wished he wasn't the scruffiest giant in town and bought a range of new clothes. But on his way home, he met various animals who desperately needed his help. It is a firm favourite, and the children love to join in with the repeated refrains. In mathematics, the children explored number bonds to make ten. They used the tens frames as a manipulative to find the various combinations and learnt that a bond can include zero, for example, $10 + 0 = 10$. If you would like a mathematical challenge over the festive period, why not ask your child to show you how many ways they can make ten? Can they complete it sequentially, starting with $0 + 10 = 10$ all the way through to $10 + 0 = 10$?

In RE, a special visitor came to talk to the children about the Jewish festival of light - Hanukkah. Mrs Jordan shared the story of Hanukkah and showed the children a beautiful menorah. They learnt about delicious foods that are often eaten during the celebration such as donuts, pancakes and latkes and the children played with dreidels, used as part of a popular game to win chocolate coins. We would like to say a huge thank you to Mrs Jordan for such a lovely learning opportunity.

In science, the children continued to learn about animal classification. They looked at a variety of amphibians, such as frogs, toads and newts, and learnt that they can live in water and on land.

In design and technology, the children investigated moving mechanisms. They designed a festive card, which included a moving element of a slider. The children look forward to bringing their cards home to share with their families.

Next week, the children have a wonderful array of festive activities. In RE, the children will make Christingles to learn how Christians celebrate Advent. They will learn what the different parts represent and follow a series of instructions to create their own.

On Tuesday, we shall be walking together to and from the church, for some wonderful Christmas singing. As this is also party day, it might be best if the children could wear their party clothes under an angel or shepherd costume. This might just be something simple like a halo or tinsel wings or a tea cloth on their head if they want to be a

shepherd. If they would rather just wear their party clothes, that would be wonderful too.

Party Food - We have a number of pupils in school with food allergies or special dietary requirements, so please could we ask that you send your child to school with a named pack of party food for their individual consumption; for example, a sandwich, some crisps, a piece of fruit and a carton of drink etc. This is in addition to their packed lunch, if your child is bringing one in on that day. Thank you so much for helping with this. It should be a lovely afternoon, with traditional party games and a visit from a special visitor bearing gifts!

New homework will be coming home today. Please complete the homework and return it to school by Wednesday 10th January.

Year 2: What a fantastic week it has been in Year 2! The children put on an incredible Christmas concert that absolutely wowed the audience, performing it not once, not twice, but three times over the week, twice for parents, and once for the Year 1 children. This is the first time we have brought all the Year 2 children together for a performance and what an amazing job they did, listening carefully to directions, remembering their lines and places, and kindly helping each other if anyone got a little stage struck. We are so very proud of every single one of them!

In between rehearsals and performances, the children have been continuing to learn about 2D and 3D shapes. They have drawn 2D shapes on squared paper, explored vertical lines of symmetry on shapes and sorted 2D shapes according to their properties.

The children have enjoyed lots of Christmas themed activities and crafts, including some surprises that they will bring home next week.

Next week is a short, but busy, week. The children will hear some festive stories and take part in some Christmas crafts. Monday is Christmas dinner day, kindly supported by the FROG team. Class Christmas parties take place on Tuesday afternoon, and we hope to see a special visitor on his rounds! School closes at 2.00pm on Wednesday for the Christmas break. There is no After School Club on this day.

Children can come to school in party clothes on Tuesday but return to school uniform on Wednesday. Please can each child bring in a named individual bag of party food, to avoid any problems with allergies. This should be in addition to a packed lunch if your child has one.
