Yesterday, all our Reception children accessed their own farm experience brought on site especially for them. In this way, all the children were able to enter in small groups and spend very intimate time with the animals, stroking them and learning about them very directly. A wide range of animals were present including pygmy goats, pigs, sheep, a donkey, a dog, a rabbit, ducks, hens and guinea pigs! The children had a wonderful time.

Sports Day: *This week children have been practising in preparation for Sports Day and Mr Pullin, our brilliant Sports Specialist who started with us many years ago as an apprentice, has been preparing all year-groups for the forthcoming Sports Day by giving sessions on Olympic values and standards to all classes, so the children will be fully prepared to participate with great sportsmanship as well as with terrific sporting standards. Now we only have to hope for perfect weather on Tuesday!*

Sports Day is Tuesday 8th July. Please be prepared for cancellation in the event of the school field being too wet. We will text or send an email and put a message on the school website if a decision to cancel is taken in the morning. The reserve date will be Wednesday 16th July.

- **Dress:** Please dress children in their PE kits (polo shirts, shorts and training shoes) in the morning. They will need to wear a hat and sunscreen. Please supply your child with a water bottle.
- **Times of events:**
 - Reception: 9.05am - 10.00am
 - Year 1: 10.05am - 11.10am
 - Year 2: 11.15am - 12.20pm
- **Access to school field:** At 9.00am, the school caretaker will lock all external gates as usual except the Nursery entrance gate which will be kept open all morning. Please enter and exit the school premises through this gate. Please enter the sports field by walking along the Year 1 playground, then through the field gate.
- **Spectator rules:** We'll be marking off with barrier tape the spectator area which we would ask you to stay inside please. We will also have some chairs available.
 - Children must stay with their classes and not go with parents, for example, to use the toilet.
 - The event should be conducted in the same way as an assembly – families are there as spectators and should not approach the children, including at the end when they are walking back to class.
 - We did have incursions last year so please be aware that this year I will stop the races if any adults come outside of the allocated areas.

I know this is difficult and we understand that you're very proud of your children but this is a big event, and we need to keep all the children safe. This event taking place as it does on the sports field outside is the one time in the year when the school is not in control of who turns up to watch. We therefore have to make incredibly sure that we are keeping a clear gap between spectators and the children. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

There will be a wide variety of activities taking place over the week and each year-group will choose to focus on a different part of the world. This

will include African Dance and Chinese Dragon Movement workshops as well as a special Mosaic Workshop for our Year 2 pupils as a gift for them and to give them an opportunity to create a lasting artefact for our school to remember them all.

If you are able to contribute to the richness of this experience in any way, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Nursery Pirate Day on Friday 11th July: *The staff will all be dressed in pirate costumes, and it would be wonderful if your child could dress up too. There will be lots of exciting pirate-related activities for the children to enjoy. Nursery staff will be running the different activities, so children do need to be accompanied by an adult if at all possible. If you are able to attend, it would be wonderful if you could come and enjoy this adventure together with your child.*

Nursery: *This week in Nursery, the children were excited to hear the special news that we are going to have a Pirate Day! They were eager to begin counting down the number of sleeps until Pirate Day.*



In expressive art and design, the children have been busy making sand art, drizzling PVA glue and adding sand. Some children practised writing the letters of their name with the sand and glue. Tito took great care to write the letters in his name and commented, 'I liked putting the sand on'. The children were delighted to learn the song, 'A Sailor Went to Sea'. They learnt to clap the rhythm of the song and then worked with a partner to clap together. The children were happy to sing and clap with different friends each day and they all had great fun singing this song.

The children explored the seaside and harbours this week through pictures, stories and videos. They were fascinated to learn about different types of boats, harbours and the purpose of lighthouses. They noticed the patterns on lighthouses and discussed how they help to keep boats safe. The children made their own lighthouses and beach houses using rectangles and squares and creatively made boats using 2d shapes.

In mathematics, the children played a range of number games using ice cream and pirate themes. They matched numbered ice creams, sorted sea animals into coloured groups and built towers of different heights using blocks. The children practised ordering numbers to ten using golden coins and pirate treasure, showing great focus and enthusiasm.

Next week, the children will listen to a range of pirate stories, sing lots of pirate songs and take part in yoga. In physical development, they will jump the waves and learn a special 'walk the plank' move. The children will also be preparing invitations for their friends for our Pirate Day, which will take place on Friday 11th July.



Reception:



Yesterday, the children had a fantastic visit from Ark farm. They brought in a range of animals and after a wonderful introduction of questions and answers, the children had the opportunity to get into the large enclosure and handle the animals. During the visit, the children were asked to name the two baby goats. The children thought of some particularly good suggestions and in the end, it was decided the kids should be called 'Sera and Era'. Well done to Marshall in Ban Owl class for thinking of two marvellous names! Evie from Tawny Owl class was excited to meet Evie the goat and said 'We are both Evie! That is so funny,' and when asked what baby goats are called, Thea in Barn Owl class said, 'They are called goatlings.' After visiting the farm animals, Calliope in Snowy Owl class said, 'I loved all the animals and especially the guinea pig and rabbit!'

On Wednesday, the children enjoyed participating in a circus workshop. They had the opportunity to spin plates, do some juggling and watch some magic tricks. Mina in Snowy Owl class really enjoyed the workshop and said, 'I have magic hair,' when the magician did a trick.



In literacy, the children wrote sentences about which fillings they would like in their sandwiches. Popular fillings included jam and cheese but a few of the children thought of more interesting fillings for their sandwich such as aioli, marmite, and strawberries!

This week's poem is titled 'Summer Leaves':

*Come walk with me on a summer's day,
Up the road, a long, long way.
Summer leaves are all you can see,
So lovely and healthy and green as can be.
The tall green treetops are ever so high,
Almost touching the bright blue sky.
Come walk with me in a summer breeze,
And see the sunlight glinting through the trees.*

In mathematics, the children revisited doubles to 10 and loved playing the mathematical game 'Reverse Bingo', where they were given the answer and had to work out its double. The children really enjoyed calling out 'Bingo!' when they placed the final counter on their board.

The Musician of the Month for June was Bob Marley. The children found out he played the guitar and was a vegetarian. Bob Marley washed his hair but never combed it and had dreadlocks in his hair. The children particularly enjoyed listening to his band 'Bob Marley and the Wailers' and the songs, 'Three Little Birds' and 'Could You Be Loved'. This month's Musician of the Month is George Ezra.

Next week the children will be making a sandwich and choosing a filling such as jam, honey, or cheese spread, or they may just choose to have butter as their filling. In mathematics, the children will be creating and continuing a repeating pattern using coloured cubes and in understanding the world, they will be finishing off their seasons book by painting a tree in summer bloom.

Year 1: It has been another busy week in Year 1! On Wednesday, the children had a wonderful time learning circus skills! They were very adept at spinning plates, stacking cups, rolling flower sticks and walking on tight ropes and stilts. In the afternoon they did a Sports Day practice on the field to understand how the races will be organised.



In mathematics, the children completed their learning all about position and direction and started to learn about time. In English, they have enjoyed the story 'Barnaby Bear At The Seaside'. With Barnaby Bear's help, the children have learnt about staying safe at the seaside and made beach safety posters. They found out about lifeguards and beach flags. They considered questions they would like to ask a lifeguard and wrote them, remembering to use a question word and a question mark. In geography the children learnt about aerial views and plans. Barnaby Bear drew a map of his caravan,

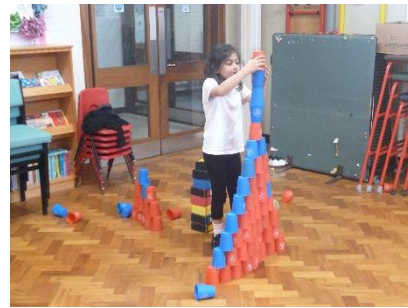
so the children drew a plan of their classrooms. They used a key to identify key features such as the tables, chairs and doors. In phonics the children have continued to learn about alternative spellings. Finally, in PSHCE they celebrated ways in which they have grown over the last year.

Thank you for returning homework books. There is no more homework this year. We have loved seeing all the wonderful ways in which the children have explored their learning with you. Thank you for all the effort you have put in to celebrating your children's learning in this way.

Next week, the children have Forest School again. They will be very excited for Sports Day on Tuesday. Please note the timings and arrangements at the start of the newsletter. In English they will research the RNLI, having first heard about Barnaby Bear's adventures. They will draw a plan of the Forest School area in geography. The children will continue to learn about time in mathematics. On Thursday morning they will visit their new classrooms for Year 2.

Year 2: The children have enjoyed a wonderful week in Year 2. On Wednesday, all the children had the opportunity to take part in a Circus Skills workshop, trying their hand at plate spinning and juggling. They had an amazing time, while following instructions and demonstrating how to respect resources. Well done, Year 2!



In English this week, the children continued to learn the African folktale of 'The Papaya That Spoke'. They chose the characters they will include when they write their own version of the story and made a story plan that them will help them with their writing.

In mathematics, the children continued to learn about statistics. They learnt how to draw and interpret pictograms with a 1:1 key, and to draw and interpret statistics with 1:2, 1:5 and 1:10 keys.

In design and technology, the children used fabric pens to decorate the material for their cushion and began to sew it together. In PSHCE, they discussed 'good' and 'bad' touches and shared the types of touches they like and dislike. In computing, the children explored surrealist art and used Purple Mash to create their own artwork. In geography, they used aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

In English next week, the children will use their story plans to write their own version of 'The Papaya That Spoke'. In mathematics, they will start a new unit of work, learning about position and direction. In geography, the children will learn how to use an atlas to locate places in the United Kingdom. In design and technology, they will continue to sew their cushions.

Sports Day takes place on Tuesday next week, with the Year 2 races starting at 11.15am. Please can children come to school in their PE kit and have a fresh bottle of

water with them. In the afternoon, the children will visit the Junior School with their current teacher, to ask questions and explore the playground. Thursday is Moving Up day and the children will spend the morning at the Junior School with their new teachers. On Friday, the Year 2 children will visit Woburn Safari Park. A checklist of information will be sent home with your child next week.



