***A huge thank you to so many of you who have spoken to me so kindly and appreciatively about sports day. I've had so many comments from parents that Sports Day this year, organised by our phenomenal sports specialist and former sporting apprentice Mr Pullin, was the best many parents had ever seen. We owe an immense debt of gratitude to Mr Pullin because he runs this event so beautifully – he works so hard, prepares the site and the pupils with such care and conscientiousness. He is truly a credit to himself, to our school and to our pupils. And didn't the children do themselves proud! Sportsmanship as well as really high-level skill was in evidence throughout. Mr Pullin delivers sessions to each class on the Olympic Values prior to the races and I would say these were demonstrated consistently throughout. ***The Grand Finale is today with the beyond fabulous Nursery Pirate Day – one of the absolutely key events of the year! It's astonishing how often Year 2 children in their leavers' assemblies say that this event was their most memorable and loved of their entire time in the school! Our truly tremendous Nursery team work so hard to prepare for the day including a vast range of exciting activities. We are so very, very grateful to them. What a week!***

**Regeneration underpass art competition unveiling event:** On Wednesday 9th July, as part of the regeneration for Stevenage project, schools across Stevenage joined forces to celebrate the unveiling of the specially designed and decorated underpasses.

During the autumn term, children from The Giles Nursery and Infants' School entered a competition for their artwork to be part of a design for the selected Stevenage underpasses. We were so happy to hear that Livia and Alana, in Penguin class, were winners out of more than 900 entries.

The regeneration project team invited Mrs Humphrey, Livia and Alana to the unveiling event. This took place at the Martin's Way/Hertford Road roundabout underpasses by The John Henry Newman School on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> July. These are the underpasses that are below the roundabout with the traffic lights. You are welcome to go and visit the artwork and celebrate the collaboration of school children across Stevenage.



**Happy announcement:** It is with the greatest pleasure that I am able to tell you that our dear Miss Hill had been successfully appointed as Deputy Head. She is due to take up this position in the autumn when she will be non-class-based but will continue to lead Year 2 and to support that terrific team. Miss Hill is an outstanding teacher and, in addition to her deep knowledge of the school, has led us in key areas such as English, Assessment and Pupil Premium. I am absolutely delighted at the prospect of working even more closely with her! Well done and congratulations, Miss Hill!

**One World Week:** Next week is One World Week. If you have knowledge, or background in, one or more cultures, we would love for you to come in and speak to the children. We'd love for people to read stories in another language, and then in English. There will be a wide variety of activities taking place over the week and each year-group will choose to focus on a different part of the world. This will include African Dance and Chinese Dragon Movement workshops as well as a special Mosaic Workshop for our Year 2 pupils as a gift for them and to give them an opportunity to create a lasting artefact for our school to remember them all.

If you are able to contribute to the richness of this experience in any way, please speak to your child's class teacher.

**Reception clothing plea:** If you have any socks, pants, trousers, skirts or tops that fit Reception age pupils, please will you donate them to us? We always need spares and we are running out. Thank you.

**Rocksteady Band Lessons:** Rocksteady run band lessons in our school once a week. If your child will be in Year 1 or Year 2 in September, and you would like to book band lessons for them, please see the information flyers at the end of this newsletter. Please note, that parents book and pay directly to Rocksteady. Lessons take place normally on a Wednesday morning. You can also pick up an information leaflet at the office.

**Nursery:** This week in Nursery, the children have been excitedly counting down the number of sleeps until Pirate Fun Day. They listened to lots of pirate stories and loved

*singing pirate songs with their friends. The children made bunting to decorate the Nursery, a sign to welcome all pirates and pirate flags.*

*In physical development, the children enjoyed pretending to walk the plank in the garden with their friends. They loved taking part in a Cosmic Yoga session and thoroughly enjoyed an adventure with 'Popcorn the Dolphin'. Each group was excited to hold hands together, move up and down and click like a dolphin as they swam to the smugglers' cave to find the treasure.*

*In phonics, the children revisited the letter sounds they have learnt this year. They confidently shared objects that started with the sounds /s/, /a/, /t/, /p/, /i/, /n/. The children consolidated their understanding of alliteration and thought of two or more words that start with the same sound. Well done, Ladybirds!*

*The children went to visit their Reception classes on Thursday and did incredibly well adjusting to the changes. They came back happy, excited children and everyone had a smile on their face.*

*On Friday, we had a fantastic time at Pirate Fun Day! The children were eager to get involved with the pirate-themed activities and looked amazing in their pirate costumes. They all went home with a wonderful collection of art and craft activities, including treasure maps, medallions, parrots, pirate hats and telescopes. The children sailed the seven seas in the pirate ship and bravely walked the plank! They decorated and ate a biscuit and even took some popcorn home too! It was a wonderful day enjoyed by everyone. Thank you to all the parents for your support. Harper said, 'I had a lovely pirate time. Thank you for all the decorating pirate things!'*



*Next week, the children will have lots of fun preparing for their summer break and enjoying time in Nursery with all their friends.*

*Please can we ask for all library books to be returned. If you are having a summer clear out, we would be grateful for any donations of school uniform.*

***Reception:*** This week, after many practices, the children took part in a fantastic Sports Day. Harry from Barn Owl class, Sabin from Tawny Owl class and Jaxon from Snowy Owl class were chosen to carry the Olympic torch. These children were chosen because throughout the year, they have been good sportspeople, always enthusiastic to learn new skills, persevered when faced with a challenge and always encouraged their peers to have a try. All the Reception children were proud of their achievements in each of the races.

*In mathematics, the children used coloured cubes to create and continue repeating patterns. Some of the children created patterns using three colours, whilst other children challenged themselves to create a repeating pattern using up to six colours! The children loved the lesson activity where they created a line of action patterns, for example, one child did two jumps, the next child clapped their hands twice, the next child did two hops and the next child ran on the spot. It was great to see the children choosing what action they would like to do in the pattern.*

*In understanding the world, the children went outside and used fine brushes to paint a tree in summer bloom. The children's seasons books are now complete and will be passed on to their Year 1 teachers.*

*The children thoroughly enjoyed making a sandwich and choosing a filling. They were able to choose from honey, strawberry jam, or cheese spread. The children had to follow a set of instructions before the final instruction of eating their sandwich!*



*In understanding the world, the children found out how harvesting wheat has changed over the years and created a pictorial timeline. They watched a man using a scythe, a film clip from 1938 of a combine harvester being pulled by at least a dozen horses and a film of a modern combine harvester cutting the crops and dispensing the wheat into a tractor trailer. The children loved making scythes made from rolled tubes of card and pieces of curved card and acted out cutting the crops using their scythes.*

*This week's poem is called 'Combine Harvester'.*

*The farmer knows when it is time,  
To climb aboard the big combine,  
And make the blades spin round and round,  
To slice through crops above the ground.*

*With a cloud of dust, a steady thrum,  
Like a giant insect's noisy hum,  
It sorts the grain and spits out stalks,  
Day and night it goes back and forth.*

*You'll see it working when it's dry,  
But if it's wet don't even try.*

*For then it's silent in the field,  
A shiny beast with a mouth of steel.*

*Next week in literacy, the children will be writing sentences about what actions they can do in PE. In mathematics, the children will be using small world resources such as farm animals to discuss where animals are positioned on the farm. The children will also be listening to the story 'The Secret Path' by Nick Butterworth and using wooden blocks to create mazes for their partner to solve.*

*In understanding the world, the children will be listening to the story 'Noah's Ark' and will be using the app 'Sketchbook' on the iPad to create rainbows. They will also make a rainbow using a paper plate.*

*Next week we will be collecting library books in. Please would you make sure any library books your child has borrowed are in their book bag for us to collect.*

*Year 1: What a wonderful start to the week we had with the fantastic sportsmanship of our Year 1 pupils on Sports Day. They cheered on their classmates and the other classes; they competed with their best efforts and celebrated their own personal achievements; they walked to and from the field so responsibly, proudly waving national flags in true Olympic spirit. It was a joy-filled sporting morning and we are very grateful to Mr Pullin and Mrs Brown for all their organisation.*

*Congratulations to the Year 1 children who put on a fabulous rock concert with Rocksteady and their bandmates from Year 2 on Wednesday.*

*Yesterday was moving-up day. The Year 1 children looked so grown-up walking to their new Year 2 classrooms and came back full of enthusiasm. We are so proud of how the children have grown through this year.*

*In learning, the children have completed their mathematics unit on time. They have learnt how to read o'clock and half-past times. They can identify the minute hand and the hour hand. They know that there are 60 minutes in an hour and 60 seconds in a minute. The children also learnt about the sequence of the days of the week and the months of the year and enjoyed looking at diaries and calendars to work out dates and when events are happening. The children have been fascinated researching RNLi lifeboats. They wrote fact files about all-weather and inshore lifeboats in English. They were amazed to hear about the work of the RNLi and to see on the website how many times lifeboats had been launched in the week around the country. In design and technology, the children have designed a jellyfish mobile that they will make using textiles next week. They practised their map-making skills in geography by drawing a plan of our Forest School area. In Forest School, the children worked in teams, using collaboration and critical thinking to build dens. They had to see if their den could withstand rain and wind, simulated by the teachers pouring water on them and giving them a shake.*



*Forest School is a truly wonderful experience for the children. If your child has grown out of their puddle suit, jogging bottoms, long-sleeved t-shirts, or welly boots, please would you donate them to us so we have spare clothes in reserve for next year's Year 1 children to use if necessary.*

*Next week the excitement continues with One World Week. The children will also write a recount in English all about the seaside history day they experienced recently. They will make their jellyfish mobiles in design and technology. They will be finding out about different cultures around the world.*

*We would be very grateful if next week you could send in a very sturdy large bag with your child's name on it. The children have done ever so much learning and will be bringing home a lot of books at the end of term.*

*In the meantime we look forward to seeing many of our Year 1 children performing at Todd in the Hole this Sunday as part of the Community Choirs Set on the main stage at 11.30. If your child is participating, please ensure they arrive with their accompanying grown-up at 11am.*

*Year 2: It has been an incredibly exciting week in Year 2! The children took part in some fantastic activities, which began with Sports Day on Tuesday. We are so proud of all the children for taking part and trying their very best. The children demonstrated excellent sportsmanship and perseverance, showing the Olympic values. Well done Year 2!*



*The children had two transition sessions to Giles Junior School. On Tuesday afternoon, they visited their new classrooms, asked the current Year 3 children lots of questions and explored their new playground. On Thursday morning, they spent time with their new teachers and completed an 'all about me' activity.*

*At the time of writing, all the Year 2 children (and adults!) are incredibly excited about the trip to Woburn Safari Park on Friday! There will be a full report and photographs in next week's newsletter.*

*In English this week, the children used their story plans to write their own version of 'The Papaya That Spoke'. In mathematics, they learnt to use the language of position, such as 'above', 'below' and 'between'. They also learnt to use the language of movement, such as 'forwards', 'backwards', 'left' and 'right'. They also learnt to describe turns.*

*Next week is One World Week. The children will take part in two special activities – an African dance workshop and a commemorative mosaic workshop. The mosaic workshop is just for the Year 2 children, and they will work together to create a*

*mosaic for the whole school to enjoy. In class, the children will read the book 'My Granny Went to Market' and learn about some of the countries Granny visits on her magic carpet.*

*End of year reports will be sent home next week, and we will send home your child's workbooks next Friday. Please send in a couple of sturdy plastic bags as the books are very heavy.*

*Looking forward to the final week of term, end of year parties will take place on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> July. Children should bring their own party food in a labelled bag, separate to their packed lunch if they have one. Please remember, we are a nut-free school so no foods containing nuts are allowed on the premises. Children can wear party clothes for the day but return to school uniform for the last day of term on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> July.*



