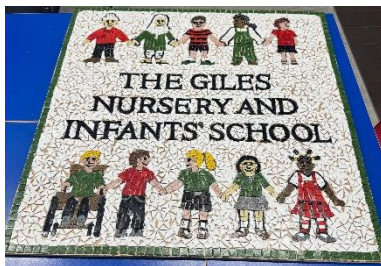

***Dear Parents/Carers***

***One World Week (which in fact lasts until the end of term!) has so far been the most spectacular success. Staff have worked hard to enable children to extend their learning and to experience a wide range of exciting activities from around the world. This week children have enjoyed some glorious workshops including African dance in Nursery and Years 1 and 2 on Tuesday and mosaic-creation by Year 2 on Thursday. Next Monday Reception through to Year 1 will enjoy a Chinese Dragon dance workshop. Each year group has explored different countries and children have engaged in many other lovely activities which will be outlined in class sections below.***

***The mosaic created by the Year 2 pupils is of our special, inclusive school logo and it is a most spectacular piece of artwork. The history of our logo is that many years ago I worked with an artist, giving my concept of what I felt should be included in a school logo indicating real equity; the artist put together a series of designs and ended with this one.***



***It feels so special now to have our Year 2 pupils working with a mosaic artist today to create this beautiful piece of work. It is a true legacy for our school.***

*Nursery: This week in Nursery, the children enjoyed looking back at the many stories, songs and special moments we've shared throughout the year. They revisited some of their favourite books and talked excitedly about the characters, pictures and authors they've come to love. It was heartwarming to hear them remember not just the stories but the activities they had done too; they fondly remembered all of the painting, role play and imagining sparked by the pages of a book.*

*The children proudly shared which stories had made them laugh and learn as they joined in with repeated refrains. They recalled rhymes and there was a lot of joy as they took turns to sing old favourites. 'I'm a Little Teapot' was a new addition this*

*week and quickly became a hit! The children sang the rhyme with enthusiasm, joining in with the actions with great balance. In expressive art and design, the children painted colourful teapots using bright colours, they made teapot stick puppets and practised their fine motor skills with themed pencil control sheets.*

*As part of One World Week, the children took part in an energetic African dance workshop. They listened closely to the rhythm of the drums and followed the*



*instructor's lead as they rolled their arms, pointed their feet and moved their hands in time with the music. Bear smiled and said, 'This is fun!' as they practised moving in unison, learning to follow one another and keep to the beat. Harper listened carefully and commented, 'I hear drums.' The children were introduced to the Fume Fume dance from Ghana and learnt that Ghana is a country in Africa. At the end of the workshop Rose proudly recalled the country, 'Ghana,' while Sia remembered the name of the dance, 'Fume Fume' and Ava G added, 'Africa!' After building the moves together step by step, they*

*finished with a burst of freestyle dancing, clapping and moving freely to the rhythm.*

*The children were fascinated by the ladybirds flying in the garden this week! This inspired us to sing our class ladybird song and explore more ladybird themed activities. They made ladybird bookmarks and independent drawings of ladybirds and painted their own ladybirds with great attention to detail. Evie was especially gentle when one landed on her arm and called out, 'Look! It's walking on me!' as others gathered around to take a closer look.*

*In mathematics, the children continued to explore numbers to five, using subitising skills to recognise small amounts without counting. The children revisited their knowledge of shapes and confidently identified triangles, squares, rectangles, ovals and star shapes. They counted the number of corners and sides on each shape and sang their group shape songs proudly.*

*In phonics, they played a game of 'I spy' using initial sounds and name recognition, showing growing confidence in phonics as they spotted items beginning with /s/, /a/, /t/, /p/, /i/ and /n/.*

*Next week, the children will be celebrating their final few days in Nursery. We're looking forward to more songs, stories and sunshine in the garden. On Tuesday, the children will have a farewell party. There is no need to send in party food as this will be provided as a special treat. The children can wear non-uniform.*

**Reception:** *This week the children celebrated One World Week and focused on the Biblical story of Noah's Ark. They enjoyed watching a version of this story by Lucy Cousins on YouTube ([Noah's Ark](#)). The children were set the challenge of naming the animals that went on board Noah's Ark. It helped them decide which animals would go onto their Noah's Ark to make a class book. The children loved the song 'The animals went in two by two'. They enjoyed choosing a partner and parading around the classroom, the corridor and the garden singing the song.*

*The children found out how a rainbow is formed and drew the colours of a rainbow on half a paper plate. They put a sun in the centre and added blue crepe paper to represent the rain. When drawing the colours of the rainbow, Evie in Barn Owl class said, 'Wherever you go, the rainbow follows you,' and Daisy in Barn Owl class said, 'When the rain is falling and the sun is shining, the rainbow comes out.' In a second*

*activity the children used the app 'Sketchbook' on the iPads to create a rainbow. They used the colour wheel to carefully select the seven colours.*

*This week's poem is linked to rainbows and is called 'I can sing a rainbow'.*

*In literacy, the children wrote sentences about what they can do. Many were linked to PE actions such as star jumps, running and crossing the monkey bars. Some children wrote they could read without sounding out words or draw pictures of their friends.*

*In mathematics, the children used wooden blocks to create mazes for their partner to solve. They loved watching the story 'The Secret Path' by Nick Butterworth, where Percy the Park Keeper and his animals friends get lost in the park maze but are rescued by a hedgehog. Each child enjoyed the challenge of taking a small world character through their partner's maze to find a gold coin.*



*The children's reading books will be collected in on Wednesday morning and new books will be allocated in readiness for Year 1. Please remember the children can also access Bug Club and Numbots during the summer and this will help them to continue to make progress with their reading and their mathematical knowledge.*

*All the Reception staff hope the children and their families have a wonderful summer holiday and wish the children all the best for their year ahead in Year 1.*

*Year 1: This week has been a really vibrant and exciting discovery of our wonderful world. The children had an amazing time in the African dance workshop and enjoyed listening and moving to the rhythms of the music. In class they learnt that Africa is a continent and that there are many countries and cultures within it. They enjoyed seeing some of the diversity of the continent with a CBeebies Go-Jettors presentation that looked at wildlife and famous landmarks on the continent. The children enjoyed making sunset pictures of savannah wildlife. Jason in Walker Bear Class brought in a*

*globe for speaking and listening time and was keen to show the class where the continent of Africa is located.*



*The next day, the Walker Bear children were lucky to travel in their imaginary aeroplane to Asia and learn about the country Bangladesh. Thank you to Mrs Rabbani for sharing your love for the country and wonderful insights to life, food, housing, clothing and wildlife of the region. Everyone was fascinated to hear about how rice grows. Aadam was keen to share that he has eaten jack fruit. The children enjoyed making flags with you too!*

*All the Year 1 children turned their attention to Australia, to hear about the art work of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. The children were fascinated to hear that it is the oldest art work in the world, with some examples dating back 60,000 years! They were interested to hear that art is a way of preserving traditional stories known as Dreaming Stories and passing them on through the generations. Noah in Walker Bear Class was excited to share his knowledge of Australia and the musical instrument the didgeridoo which he said can be heard many miles away. The children painted their own sea turtles in the style of dot art, like some indigenous art work of Australia.*



*Finally, the children have listened to some folk stories of Anansi that are told in West Africa and the Caribbean region. There will be more One World Week activities on Monday to look forward to!*

*In other learning, the children learnt about odd and even numbers in mathematics. In English they wrote recounts of the seaside history day that they enjoyed recently and tried hard to make sure they wrote in the past tense. In design and technology, the children made their jellyfish mobiles following the plans they drew last week. They had a wonderful time showing off their skills at kick rounders with Mr Pullin. They are really beginning to think tactically about how to field and how to score runs. In Forest School the children noticed a lot of ladybirds. Many children chose to count ladybirds. They were intrigued to see how many they could find and enjoyed looking at them closely using the bug pots. On Wednesday they also enjoyed another transition afternoon with their new teachers for Year 2.*

*Reports are coming home with your children today. We hope you find them informative and enjoy reading about your children's progress. We really are hugely proud of every single child's achievements. Please keep sending in big bags for your children's books. We will send the books home next week. As we are collecting all the*

**books together now, we are not sending home a reading book this weekend. Please do continue to read with your child using Bug Club through the holidays. You can also use Numbots to keep up the fast maths!**

**On Tuesday we have our class parties. Children are invited to come to school in party clothes on Tuesday, but not fancy dress, please. Please will you provide your child with their own named bag of party food. Please do not include any nut ingredients, as they can cause very serious allergic reactions.**

**Year 2: It has been another fantastic week in Year 2, with the children thoroughly enjoying One World Week. In class, the children read the book 'My Granny Went to Market' by Stella Blackstone. At the start of the story, Granny buys a magic carpet in Istanbul. She travels around the world, collecting a variety of interesting objects. The children learnt a little about some of the countries Granny visits, including China, Thailand, Japan and Australia. They made some beautiful crafts based on the objects Granny collects on her travels, including origami cats, paper plate llamas and Chinese lanterns.**

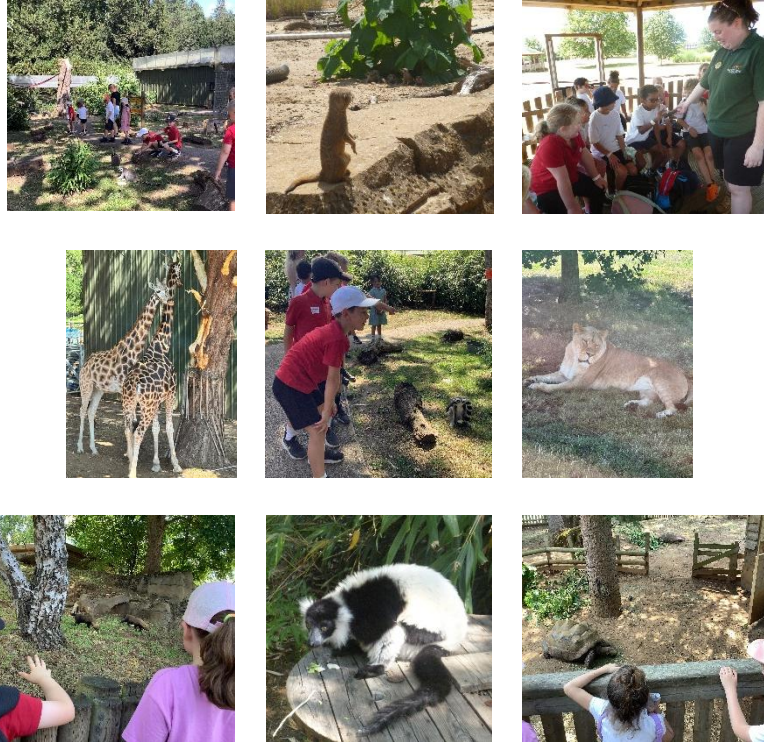


**On Tuesday, the children took part in an African dance workshop. The children were so enthusiastic and listened brilliantly to learn a routine in only half an hour. On Thursday, the children took part in a very special mosaic workshop, where every child in Year 2 contributed to the making of a beautiful mosaic of our school logo. We will let you know when this will be unveiled in the autumn term.**



**The children also spent time this week remembering our trip to Woburn Safari Park last Friday – and what a fantastic trip it was! It is the first time we've organised an end of year excursion for the Year 2 children and each one of them helped to make it a resounding success. The day started with the road safari, with the children having the most amazing view of the animals from the coach. They saw black bears in trees, lions lounging in the grass and zebras grazing. The rhinos, giraffes, ostriches and elephants**

*all put in an appearance, but sadly the tiger was feeling a little shy and didn't come out to say 'hello'! Once the coach had parked, the children walked to a shady spot to enjoy their lunch, before the classes split up to explore the foot safari. Along the way, they saw otters, penguins, sealions, meerkats, lemurs, wallabies and giant tortoises.*



*The children also took part in a 'poo in the zoo' themed workshop, led by the Woburn Rangers. The children learnt how to spot whether a poo has been produced by a carnivore or a herbivore, and they had the opportunity to touch realistic models of different animals' poo. The children were so engaged, asking lots of questions and showing what they have learnt in key stage one about different animals. We were very impressed!*

*The children behaved impeccably throughout the day and coped so well in the heat. We are very proud of you, Year 2. Thank you for making it such a special day!*

*End of year reports were sent home today. We hope you enjoy reading about your child's progress. We would love to receive your comments on the sheet enclosed with the report.*



