Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been another terrific week in school, despite the changing weather. Children have been dressed warmly and are enjoying the seasonal change. Reception classes had a wonderful time with Stevenage Sporting Futures on Tuesday having a special workshop and children looked so beautiful yesterday ready for their photos.

Next week is another busy, exciting time as Year 2 experiences a Christmas Journey event and Year 1 has a full-on day at their History of Toys workshop.

Open evening: Thank you so much to all who attended. The school looked jaw-droppingly fantastic, as it always does. Lots of families visited who are looking for Nursery and Reception places next year and the feedback was terrific both from newcomers and from all of you – thank you so much for your kindness. It is deeply appreciated. Some comments included:

- ***My daughter loves the school. She has progressed so well with her reading. Staff are very friendly 😊***

Thank you all for your generosity and recognition – I can't tell you how much, overall and in every way, your support means. We all feel deeply privileged and honoured at this school to have such warm relationships with our families. The positive impact this good relationship has on our children is profound and so important it can hardly be measured.

Occasional Day: Do remember next Friday 28th November is our annual Occasional Day and the school is closed for the day.

Illness and attendance: *It's the time of year when sniffles, coughs and colds are doing the rounds. Colder weather and dark evenings can leave us all feeling under the weather, but these minor ailments can usually be treated with children's paracetamol. Unless your child has a fever, we recommend bringing your child to school, as they often brighten up during the day. School staff are happy to administer medicine if needed and will always contact you if we believe your child is too unwell to be in school. 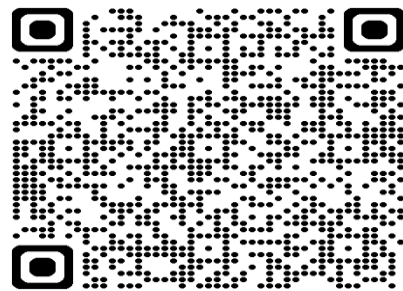

Volunteer work in school: *We appreciate our volunteers so greatly and it is a role that in turn can give those who volunteer in school a lot of happiness. Our children are so fantastic and the teaching staff so incredible – it's an opportunity to make new friends and to pick up new skills at the same time as supporting our children's learning. Please speak to me if you are interested in doing some volunteer work in our school. Some volunteers also go on to do apprenticeships with us, so if you are interested in this, do please speak to me.*

Nursery: *This week, the children thoroughly enjoyed hearing and retelling the story 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?' by Bill Martin Jr. They learnt the order of the animals in the story and enthusiastically joined in using Makaton signs. The*

children learnt the Makaton signs for 'bear', 'bird', 'duck', 'horse', 'frog', 'cat', 'dog', 'sheep', 'goldfish', 'teacher' and 'children'.

The children had a fantastic time creating a painting of a brown bear using a range of mark making tools, including brushes, sponges and forks. They added one nose, two ears and two eyes. Each bear looks wonderful and unique, and they are proudly displayed in Ladybird Class.



The children were fascinated to learn about bears from around the world. They learnt facts about brown bears, sun bears, sloth bears, giant panda bears, polar bears and spectacled bears. The children were amazed to learn that sun bears have a long tongue to reach honey, and black bears have sharp claws. Isaac L recalled, "Black bears are good at climbing." Gabriella remembered, "Polar bears have really sharp claws." Isabella added, "Bears eat fish and meat."

In mathematics, the children practised using the vocabulary 'first', 'second', 'next' and 'last' to describe the order of the animals in the story 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear. What Do You See?'. They focused on the numbers three and four, learning to say the following rhymes as they used their finger to write the number.

'Around the tree, around the tree. Now I've made the number three.'

'Down and across, and down once more, now I've made the number four.'

In preparation for the celebrations next week, the children have loved exploring the 'Teddy's party' role play. Betsy G said, "Teddy's had the best party ever!" Next week, we will be celebrating Teddy's 4th birthday. The children can wear party clothes for Teddy's party on Thursday 28th November and will be preparing and eating jam and marmalade sandwiches. Please let us know if your child has any allergies.

As part of our celebration for Teddy we will also be joined by a familiar bear – Paddington! The children will be joining Paddington on a tour of London and all its famous landmarks. The children are welcome to bring in a special bear or teddy to show and tell from Tuesday onwards. These will be kept in a special place until home time.

The Nursery Christmas Party takes places on Thursday 18th December. The Nursery will be closed in the morning to prepare for lots of fun. All children should arrive in their party clothes at 12.30pm for an afternoon of Christmas fun. We have an entertainer planned and a surprise visitor.

***Reception:** In mathematics this week, the children focused on numbers to five. They imagined they were at a birthday party and had to match a number of candles to a numeral. Great fun was had by all the children as they made birthday cakes from*

playdough and carefully counted out the candles. When Murray in Barn Owl class had finished the activity, he exclaimed, "Every single day in school is magic!"

In expressive arts and design, the children looked at paintings by the American artist, Al Agnew and used their observational skills to paint the most fantastic pictures of wolves. They looked very carefully at the structure of the wolf's face, the direction of how the wolf's fur grew and colours of the wolf's fur. The children enjoyed mixing colours needed for their painting. The children will be showing their wolf paintings at the forthcoming class assemblies at the beginning of December.



This week's poem is a traditional nursery rhyme 'Old Mother Hubbard'.

*Old Mother Hubbard
Went to the cupboard,
To get her poor dog a bone.
But when she got there
The cupboard was bare,
And so, the poor dog had none.*

This week in phonics, the children have learnt the phonemes: 'sh', unvoiced 'th', voiced 'th' and 'ng'. Please see below the patten the staff use to help the children form the letters correctly.

'sh' – Make a curve, slope, make a curve back again. Lift. Start at the top, come all the way down, bounce half-way back up, go over, down and flick.

'th' – Start at the top, come all the way down and curve, lift and cross. Lift. Start at the top, come all the way down, bounce half-way back up, go over, down and flick.

'ng' – Start at the top, come down, bounce back up, go over, down and flick. Lift. Make a curve, go up to the top, come all the way down and curve to the left.

This month, the Musician of the Month is Sergei Prokofiev. The children have been watching a video of the orchestra playing the story of 'Peter and the Wolf'. They have identified the musical instruments which are used to portray the characters, and listened to a section of the story each day.

On Tuesday, Sporting Futures visited Reception to lead a PE session for each class. The theme this year was 'Wild about Nature'. The children enjoyed pretending to be a range of woodland animals creating their movements. For example, when pretending to be a grass snake, the children slid around on the floor, hissing if another snake came too close to them.



Next week in understanding the world and literacy, the children will find out facts about wolves and use a variety of natural resources to create different environments that wolves live in around the world. In mathematics, the children will partition a number and find out how many ways they can make five.

Year 1: It was truly wonderful to see so many families coming in to see the Year 1 learning on Open Evening this week. We are tremendously proud of the children's achievements, and it really made us smile to watch the children showing off their classrooms to their families. We hope you enjoyed looking around the other year groups too.



The sun shone for Forest School this week, with the leaves glowing golden and the ground less muddy. The children enjoyed using the hammock for quiet reflection time, making hedgehog dens and observing the differences in the environment from last week. They are becoming very responsible when carrying large sticks, making sure they find two friends to carry a stick with them if it is bigger than an adult. Great teamwork Year 1!



This week, the children began to learn the Christmas songs that they will sing for our Christmas at Church celebration. Please look out for a message about this special trip. We would love as many parents and carers to join us as possible.

In science, the children learnt about the key features of reptiles and identified animals that are reptiles. In art and design, they experimented with placing primary and secondary colours next to each other to see how they interact. They mixed the paint to make secondary colours. They learnt that some combinations, such as blue and orange, can make the colours seem brighter, whilst blue and green next to each other can be calming to look at. In PSHCE, the children discussed ways to show kindness to each other and thought of catchy phrases to communicate them.






The children continued to research hedgehog facts in English. They learnt to find the answer to a question and record the keywords on a spider diagram. They practised writing a sentence using the keywords, remembering to use finger spaces and full stops. Some children challenged themselves to use 'and' to include two answers in one sentence; for example, 'Hedgehogs eat slugs and snails.' In mathematics, the children practised subtraction by crossing out to find the difference, writing subtraction sentences, telling subtraction stories, and starting to use a number line.

Next week in English, the children will finish their hedgehog fact files. They will review their learning about addition and subtraction in mathematics. Year 1 also have a most wonderful history workshop on Thursday all about toys! Next Friday school will be closed. We hope you will enjoy the long weekend.

There is a new homework sheet all about toys. Please return your child's homework by Wednesday 3rd December. We love seeing the beautiful activities you do with your children!

Year 2: *It has been a lovely week in Year 2. The children have really enjoyed starting our new unit of work in English, which focuses on the 'Katie Morag' stories by Maire Hedderwick. They are really engaged with the stories and have been watching the 'Katie Morag' television series, which is available on BBC iPlayer. The series helps the children to visualise island life and consider how it differs from life in Stevenage, which links to their work in geography.*

In mathematics, the children continued to learn about addition and subtraction. They learnt some different strategies to solve addition and subtraction problems, focusing on adding to the next ten, adding across a ten and subtracting across a ten. These strategies rely on children's knowledge of the bonds to ten (pairs of numbers to ten) and builds on their work last week, when they learnt how to 'look for ten'.

<p>An example of adding to the next ten:</p> <p>Rosie is adding to the next 10</p> $82 + \boxed{8} = 90$  <p>I will use $2 + 8 = 10$ to help me find the missing number.</p>	<p>An example of adding across a ten:</p> <p>Sam uses bonds to 10 to complete the calculation.</p> $6 + 5 = 11 \quad 10 + 1 = 11$  
<p>An example of subtracting across a ten:</p> $16 - 7 = \boxed{}$  <p>I can partition 7 into 6 and 1</p> $16 - 6 = 10$ $10 - 1 = 9$ 	

In geography this week, the children revised the countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and learnt some of the key human and physical features of England. In RE, they recalled the Christian creation story and how Christians believe the world was created by God. In PSHCE, the children discussed assumptions we make about boys and girls, such as 'boys like football' or 'girls like pink'. The children worked in girl/boy pairs to discover the similarities between them and how we cannot assume someone will like something based on their gender.

In art and design, the children learnt about pointillism and had a go at creating secondary colours using the technique. They also looked at the work of Georges Seurat, a French artist who devised the pointillist technique of painting. In history, the children learnt the key features of a castle and in science, they began a new unit of learning about electricity and climate change. They shared what they already know about the topic and what they would like to find out.

Next week, the children will continue to look at the 'Katie Morag' stories by Maire Hedderwick. They will learn how to use the possessive apostrophe and use the

conjunction 'and' to join two sentences. In mathematics, they will continue to learn different strategies for addition and subtraction. In geography, the children will learn about the physical and human features of Northern Ireland and in RE, they will learn how the Buddhist faith promotes animal welfare through stories. In PSHCE, the children will look at how we are all unique and why it is important to celebrate differences.

Next week, each class will visit St Nicholas Church to take part in the Festive Journey, which forms part of our Religious Education curriculum. The children will walk to the church. Please can we ask you to ensure your child is dressed warmly and wearing appropriate footwear for the walk to and from the church.
