Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been the most tremendous and busy week in school!

Yesterday was of course World Book Day and children and staff alike enjoyed a day dedicated to honouring the wonder of the written word. So many books were shared and discussed and the children looked simply spectacular in their terrific costumes! In several classes, all the staff dressed as characters from the same story – Pelican staff were all costumed with real flair as characters from 'Rapunzel'; Penguin staff were characters from 'The Three Little Pigs'; Reception staff were from 'The Little Gingerbread Man'; and Nursery staff looked amazing as Eric Carle's 'The Bad-Tempered Ladybird' – one of the children's favourite books and of course our Nursery children are our beloved Ladybirds!

Everyone really got into the spirit of the day, looked incredible and had a wonderful time. Reception children came into the hall for their first ever assembly – and all twirled and showed their costumes just like the older children in their assembly. They really behaved beautifully.

The week included a truly lovely Nursery Open Evening with some visitors new to the school commenting that they'd never seen a Nursery that could compare with ours! Well done to our amazing Nursery team!

Thank you to everyone who attended the well-presented and informative Phonics Workshop for Year 1 parents – we all hope you found it helpful. Thank you for the suggestion that we offer workshops online. That is a terrific idea and moving forward, we will endeavour to do this.

We had a lovely Bridge Builders assembly on Tuesday on Easter, and the visitors were very impressed by our children's behaviour, knowledge – and by their lovely singing voices!

Science Week: This will take place next week and will be led by our fantastic Science Lead, Mrs Humphrey. Nursery: *It has been a lovely week in Ladybird Class with lots of outside learning. The children have continued to learn all about spring. Emily remembered, "There are four seasons." Maximos added, "Winter, spring, summer and autumn." The children have shared the story of 'Jasper's Beanstalk' and learnt the song 'Ten Little Flowers'. During child-initiated learning, the Ladybird children have been ensuring the plants growing in their gardens are well looked after, using watering cans to "give the daffodils a drink", as Marli-Grace shared.*



Continuing their learning about spring and the life cycle of a butterfly, the Ladybird children have met and begun to care for the class caterpillars. There was much excitement when they created a list of potential names for the caterpillars. The children then voted for their favourite name. The 'Crunching Munching Caterpillars' are proudly being cared for in Ladybird Class.

To celebrate Science Week, the children completed an investigation to see how seeds grow and discussed if seeds would grow on the moon! The children planted seeds in cotton wool, soil, sand and on a paper towel to compare the results. These have been proudly displayed in Ladybird Class.



In PSHE, the children sorted healthy and unhealthy foods. Everyone was eager to sort different foods and share their knowledge of healthy foods. Rianna shared that she likes to eat "bananas." Reuben remembered that he likes to drink "milk." Anthony shared, "I like to eat watermelon."

In phonics, the children continued to practise making different mouth movements and voice sounds. They were thrilled to make a variety of sounds such as "wheee", "zzzzz" and "ppppppp."

The children thoroughly enjoyed celebrating World Book Day, listening to a range of stories and dressing up as their favourite characters. They had a fantastic time in the library area, sharing stories with their peers and adults. Ladybirds, we think your costumes looked fantastic!

Next week in phonics, the children will learn about robot talk and will meet a special robot called, 'Metal Mike'. They will also be continuing to create special things for their mummies. Ladybird Class will also continue caring for their class caterpillars, observing the life cycle of a butterfly first hand.

Reception: *The children have thoroughly enjoyed participating in activities linked to World Book Day this week. To introduce the day, the Reception children listened to clues to work out which story was being described. Ben in Barn Owl class recognised one story as 'Little Red Riding Hood'. When asked to say more about this story, Ben said, "Sometimes in 'Little Red Riding Hood', the grandmother is eaten by the wolf but in other stories the woodcutter rescues the grandmother."*

Mrs Mendel invited the Reception children to their first assembly in the hall. They showed off their World Book Day costumes and sang a few songs. After the assembly, Aaryan in Snowy Owl class said he had "really enjoyed his first assembly in the hall with Mrs Mendel and showing my World Book Day clothes to everyone."

In mathematics, the children have continued to focus on number bonds totalling ten. They loved using Numicon to investigate bonds totalling ten. Some children even wrote their calculations on whiteboards.

In understanding the world, the children went for a walk around the school grounds looking for signs of spring and recording their findings by taking photographs on an iPad. When talking about signs of spring, Emily in Tawny Owl class said, "The leaves are different, and you might see baby lambs."

Next week, the children will focus on learning how to be a safe pedestrian. As part of Science Week, the children will investigate which pegs are best at keeping washing on a line and in mathematics, the children will focus on doubles to ten.

Year 1: What a fabulous day the children had yesterday celebrating World Book Day! They enjoyed listening to a range of stories and shared experiences of their favourite books. The children loved showing their costumes to each other. This was the culmination of a week of lovely activities related to books and reading. In Forest School, the children enjoyed a wonderful treasure hunt searching for lost book characters.



This week in English, the children began their new topic on fairy tales. They shared their knowledge about fairy tales and created posters displaying their ideas. They listened to the fairy tale 'Cinderella' and created a story mountain to retell the story with pictures and keywords. Then they wrote an invitation to a ball. Phonics continued with alternative pronunciations. The children revisited the grapheme 'ou', making the sound heard in 'out'. They learnt that there are three further alternative sounds: /ou/ in 'boulder', /ou/ in 'group' and /ou/ in 'could'. They also learnt the mnemonic 'oh you lucky duck' to support them in remembering the spellings for the words 'could', 'would' and 'should'. Our Book of the Week was 'Peace at Last' by Jill Murphy. The children loved joining in with the repeated phrases and the sound effects.

In mathematics, the children started their new unit of learning about place value within 50. They practised making groups of ten and identifying how many lots of ten are in 10, 20, 30, 40 and 50. They also identified how many ones are in 10, 20, 30, 40 and 50. They counted forwards and backwards and used resources including bead strings, ten frames and 100 squares to support them. In science, they described the properties of different materials, using their senses of sight and touch to investigate.

Next week in English, the children will plan an alternative ending to Cinderella. They will continue to learn about place value in mathematics. Next week is Science Week, and the children will be exploring and investigating materials further.

It was super to see so many parents at the talk about the Phonics Screening check this week. We realise it is very difficult for many people to attend, so please, in your own time, take a look at the talk on our webpage: [Year 1 Phonics Screening Check talk](#). Year 2: Following the fantastic indigenous people of North America day last week, which provided the children with first-hand experience of aspects of indigenous life, they were well prepared to ask questions, conduct research and write non-fiction books to showcase their learning in English this week.

In mathematics, the children began a new unit of learning about multiplication and division. They revised how to recognise and make equal groups, which they learnt in Year 1. They then practised adding equal groups before being introduced to the multiplication symbol.

In PSHCE, the children learnt how important relaxation and calm time is for our health. In art and design, they explored patterns that the indigenous people of North America used in their artwork and used pencils to draw some similar patterns in their sketchbooks. In history, they learnt about the life of Sitting Bull, a well-known Sioux chief. In science, they revised what plants need to grow.

On Thursday, the whole school celebrated World Book Day, with children and adults encouraged to dress up as their favourite book character. The children were so excited to see each other's costumes and the adults were incredibly impressed! Thank you to parents and carers for your support to make the day so special. The children had a fantastic day, making bookmarks, taking part in a story quiz, enjoying a book scavenger hunt and designing their own special library.



Next week is Science Week. This year's theme is 'Curiosity: What's your question?'. The children will take part in lots of activities during the week, including taking part in a 'create-a-plant' competition run by STEMPOINT, an educational charity that promotes science, technology, engineering and mathematics to young people.

In English, children will edit and finish their non-fiction books about the lives of the indigenous people of North America. In mathematics, they will learn to demonstrate a multiplication sentence as a repeated addition. The children will take part in a wonderful circus skills workshop on Tuesday.
