***Dear Parents/Carers,***

***It has been another terrific week in school and children are all enjoying the continuing beautiful weather. Thank you so much to everyone who contributed so kindly to our collection for Warm Up, Feed Up; this is such an important local charity and Tom Davison, our former pupil, was very grateful for your generosity.***

***Year 1 and 2 children absolutely loved the performance of 'The Jungle Book' this morning. The professional company brings an entire theatrical show into our school to give children an experience that's as close as possible to going to the theatre. The standard is phenomenal, and it is such a rich and exciting learning experience for our children.***



**Value of the Month: Our value of the month for May is Honesty. Honesty means telling the truth, acting truthfully, and being trustworthy in what you say and do. It involves owning up to mistakes even when it is difficult. Being honest means others can rely on you, and it helps build trust and strong friendships.**

**Term Time Absence Requests:** Recently, we have received a high number of requests for leave of absence during term time. I would like to remind you that it is not permitted for schools to authorise absence during term time. The law states that children must be in school during term-time except for medical reasons or under highly exceptional circumstances. Holidays will be unauthorised. Attendance records transfer when a child moves school so any holiday taken here will be noted moving forward.

Please may I remind you that unauthorised absence can lead to high fines and serious consequences. If unauthorised absence exceeds 10 sessions (5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period, you are at risk of receiving a fixed penalty notice from the local authority. First offence fixed penalty notices are £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days. Second offence (within three years) fixed penalty notices are £160 per parent, per child. In the case of a third offence (within three years), a penalty notice will not be issued. The case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and a fine of up to £2,500. Cases found guilty can show on a parent's future DBS certificate due to a 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

I urge you to book holidays during the 13 weeks that school is closed, to ensure your child doesn't miss key learning and you are not at risk of financial and potentially legal consequences. Thank you for your support and understanding.

**Nursery Closed on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June:** The Nursery will be closed to current pupils on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June. This is in order to allow the children who will be joining us in September 2026 an opportunity to visit with their parents. Apologies for any inconvenience and thank you for your understanding.

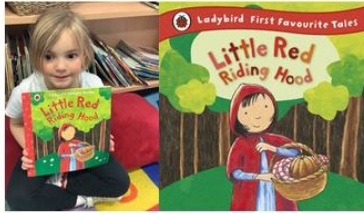

***Nursery:*** This week in Nursery, the children continued to explore pond life and learnt about animals that live in or near a pond. They were excited to play I-Spy and spotted many different animals.

*In understanding the world, the children were eager to learn more facts about frogs and creatures they might see at the pond. They learnt that frogs eat worms, insects and flies and that tadpoles eat algae from the pond. James remembered, "The pond skaters go on top of the water."*

*In expressive arts and design, the children looked at some of the pictures from Claude Monet's 'Water Lilies' series.*

*The Ladybird children proudly became artists and created their very own water lily painting. Xenia confidently remembered, "Claude Monet painted the Water Lilies!" The children also made a frog. They chose to independently paint a frog or create a frog with concertina legs. These will be on display in the Nursery very soon.*



*The Ladybird children have continued to sing the nursery rhyme, 'Five Little Speckled Frogs' and have also learnt the song, 'Little Tommy Tadpole':*

*Little Tommy Tadpole began to weep and wail.  
For little Tommy Tadpole had lost his little tail!  
His mother didn't know him as he sat upon a log.  
For little Tommy Tadpole was now mister Thomas Frog!*

*In phonics, the children learnt the letter sound /t/ and practised saying 'tiger', 'tin', 'toothbrush', 'tape measure', 'tomato', 'turtle' and many more. They also learnt the song, 'When I watch the tennis game, /t/, /t/, /t/, /t/, /t/, /t/. When I watch the tennis game, my head goes back and forth', sung to the tune of 'The Muffin Man'.*

*Next week, the children will enjoy a range of exciting activities linked to the story of 'The Rainbow Fish' by Marcus Pfister. They will use their imaginations to explore the amazing 'under the sea' role play. In phonics, the children will learn the letter sound /p/ and consolidate their understanding of alliteration.*

***Reception:*** At the end of last week, the chicks were moved from the incubator into a brooder box, to provide a warm and safe environment for them. This week, the children were so excited as they each had the opportunity to hold a chick. When seeing the chicks in their new home, Lyra in Tawny Owl class said, "They aren't in the toaster anymore!" (referring to the incubator). After holding the chicks, Freya in Snowy Owl class said, "The chick loved me, and I liked it, and it fell asleep on me."



***In literacy this week, the children generated a factual sentence about how the chick felt when they held it. Murray in Barn Owl class wrote, "The chick was really cute and really fluffy."***

***In understanding the world, the children found out about five of the most common breeds of hen living in Britain. They created collage hens using a variety of materials.***

***In mathematics, the children were adding on from a given number. First, they had to listen to how many marbles were dropped into a jar and then count on from that number. The children used a tens frame to display their answer.***

***Next week, the children will write a factual sentence about hens. In mathematics, they will investigate 2D shapes using a tangram. They will create new shapes by moving and rotating triangles, a square and a parallelogram. In expressive arts and design, the children will use the app Sketchbook to draw a picture in the style of the artist Claude Monet on an iPad. In understanding the world, the children will investigate maps and create a map for the Little Red Hen.***

***Year 1: Year 1 enjoyed the most amazing theatre production of 'The Jungle Book' today! Seeing live theatre is a truly magical way to bring stories to life. The children joined in with all the audience interactions with gusto.***

***Continuing with our wonderful Gruffalo topic this week, the children wrote poems to describe the mouse. They used adjectives to describe the eyes, ears, body, tail and whiskers. Some children challenged themselves to use more than one adjective to describe each part. They had a marvellous time making their healthy snacks of either an owl rice cake or a fox rice cake. The children observed hygiene and kitchen safety rules while following the plans they made last week. They ate their snacks and evaluated them, thinking about the appearance and taste.***

***In mathematics, the children learnt to identify the rows and columns in an array. They made arrays using cubes or counters. The children talked about how many cubes or counters were in each row or column, how many rows or columns there were, and how many cubes or counters in total. The children also practised doubling numbers. They explored what happens when an odd number is doubled. Finally, the children practised making equal groups.***

***The children learnt about warm colours in art and design and mixed their own tints and shades of a warm colour by adding black or white in different amounts. In PSHCE, the children discussed ways to greet someone and talked about how they like their friends and teachers to greet them. In PE, they started to put their batting and fielding skills into practice by playing rounders. In computing, the children learnt about 'objects' and 'actions' and used code blocks to write a line of computer code. In science, they observed how the bulbs they planted in the autumn have grown and developed buds.***



***Next week, the children begin a new non-fiction English topic about sunflowers. They will learn about commands, or 'bossy verbs', which are used to write instructions. They will look at the painting 'Sunflowers' by Vincent Van Gogh, and will begin to make their own sunflower art. In science, they will learn the names of some common garden plants and design their own garden. They will also plant sunflower seeds. In mathematics, the children will begin to learn about fractions. In Year 1, the children learn to identify halves and quarters of shapes and quantities.***

***Year 2: In English this week, the children continued their work based on the book 'Monsters: An Owner's Guide' by Jonathan Emmett. They used adjectives to describe different monsters and learnt how to extend their sentences using the conjunction 'with'. They then chose a monster and began to write their own guide explaining how to take care of it. They wrote sections explaining how to switch the monster on, whether it can play with pets, how to clean and care for it and some general 'dos and don'ts'. It was lovely to read the children's imaginative and humorous ideas.***

***In mathematics, the children continued to revisit their work on multiplication and division, completing word problems and calculations using a range of different strategies.***



***In design and technology, the children used a saw to make axles for their vehicle. In science, they matched animals to their offspring and discussed how some animals look very different to their babies. In art and design, they used watercolours to paint in an impressionist style. In computing, they learnt how to ask 'yes' and 'no' questions to sort information. In RE, the children learnt about the Jewish ceremonies of Bar Mitzvah and Bat Mitzvah, and their importance in celebrating a child's maturity into adulthood. In PSHCE, they discussed why conflict can occur between friends and how to resolve issues calmly.***

***In English next week, the children will write free verse poetry inspired by the poem 'Into the Blue' by Hilda Offen. In mathematics, they will learn how to measure mass, capacity and temperature. In science, they will investigate the habitats of different animals. In RE, they will learn what happens during Dastar Bandi, a Sikh ceremony. In computing, they will explore how data can be sorted in a binary tree. In PSHCE, they will learn about 'good secrets' and 'worry secrets' and think of adults they can share 'worry secrets' with.***

***The week finished with a fantastic performance of 'The Jungle Book', delivered by M&M Theatrical Productions. The children were enthralled and loved the audience participation!***
