I'm sure they all came home buzzing with everything they'd learnt and engaged in, and I hope they enjoyed sharing with you all the artefacts they'd created.

The last day of our sponsored learn a language (Years 1 and 2), sponsored scoot (Reception) and sponsored count (Nursery) ended today. You'll find more details below in the year-group letters. Any donations can be given to your class teacher or left at the school office – thank you everyone.

It has been Big Write for our Reception children this week and we are tremendously proud of the outstanding progress in writing demonstrated by our children. Next week will be Big Write for Key Stage 1 so watch this space!

- Year 2 races will take place from 11.15-12.20am.

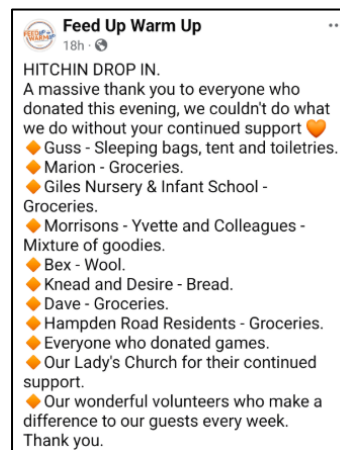

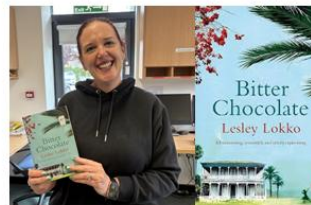

Nursery: *This week in Nursery, the children have continued to learn about animals that live under the sea. The children have begun to learn facts about several sea creatures such as an octopus. Ammar recalled, "They eat crabs and fish." The children created beautiful paintings of 'The Rainbow Fish.' These will be proudly displayed in Ladybird class very soon.*



In expressive arts and design, the children created their own star fish using air drying clay. Firstly, they rolled the clay flat and used a star cutter.

Then, they pinched the points to create the arms of the starfish before using mark making tools to add detail and pattern. The children also enjoyed creating their own jelly fish and a variety of creative and fine motor activities linked to 'under the sea'.

In phonics, the children learnt the letter sound /i/ and practised saying 'insects', 'igloo', 'injection', 'itchy' and many more. They also learnt the song, "Inky the mouse is my pet. She spilled the ink and got wet. The ink it spread all over the desk. /i/ /i/ /i/ Inky's wet!", sung to the tune of 'Hickory Dickory Dock'.

The children were excited to take part in their sponsored Count and Move on Wednesday. The Ladybirds did a fantastic job moving and counting in the following ways:

- *1 – Turn around once (count aloud "one")*
- *2 – Jump in the air twice, counting each jump as they do it (count aloud "one, two")*
- *3 – Wiggle fingers three times (count aloud "one, two, three")*
- *4 – Draw four circles in the air (count aloud "one, two, three, four")*
- *5 – Complete five star jumps (count aloud "one, two, three, four, five")*
- *6 – Clap six times (count aloud "one, two, three, four, five, six")*
- *7 – Bend knees seven times (count aloud "one, two, three, four, five, six, seven")*
- *8 – Stretch arms up in the air eight times (count aloud "one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight")*
- *9 – Stamp feet nine times (count aloud "one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine")*
- *10 – Stretch out and curl up fingers to make star shapes ten times (count aloud "one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten")*

The Ladybirds proudly took home their certificates to celebrate their achievements. Well done, Ladybirds!

Next week, the children will listen to the story of 'The Clumsy Crab' by Ruth Galloway and participate in a range of activities linked to the story. In phonics, the children will learn the letter sound /n/.

Reception: This week, the children participated in Big Write. They watched and listened to the story of 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle and told each other what they know about plants. Over the course of the week, each child has put together a fantastic piece of work linked to the story. First, they used paper to create a flower in the style of Eric Carle's illustrations from the story. When making his flower, Billy in Snowy Owl class said, "I liked sticking the petals on the flower." Next, the children labelled parts of the flower and finally, wrote facts about seeds and plants. When Andrew in Barn Owl class was writing his factual sentence, he wrote, "You plant the seeds, and you water them to make them grow."

The children acted out the story of 'The Tiny Seed' accompanied by a range of yoga poses. Some children found the flamingo pose particularly challenging to do! Here is the link for the story of 'The Tiny Seed' with yoga poses: [Yoga Read Aloud: The Tiny Seed](#)

In mathematics, the children created new shapes using right angled triangles. They had to create and discover new shapes by rotating or turning the shapes over and placing them side by side.

In expressive arts and design, the children began to create a 3D windmill. They used sponges to print artwork to represent bricks, which they will use to create their structure.



Yesterday and today, the children had the most wonderful time participating in the Reception Sponsored Scooter ride. They were all extremely excited and could not wait to have their turn. Year 1: Congratulations to the Year 1 children for delivering their sponsored 'Good Morning' greetings in five different languages. They were very proud of themselves! Thank you for supporting your child in this endeavour. Thank you also for coming to Stay and Read. It creates such a lovely celebratory buzz of reading!

In English this week, the children wrote instructions for planting a sunflower, remembering to use a 'bossy verb', as well as capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. They practised reading alien words in phonics. The story of the week was 'Burglar Bill' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. The children loved predicting what would happen next. Evie in Walker Bear class remembered hearing the story in Reception.

The children started a new unit of learning all about fractions in mathematics. The focus was on halves and quarters. They learnt that the key thing for success is to make or see two equal groups or four equal groups.

In science, the children learnt to identify some common wild plants. In PSHCE, they considered how they can be their own best friend. They had fun in art and design, trying out techniques including collage, painting, printing, and drawing to depict sunflowers. They were inspired by the famous painting 'Sunflowers' by Vincent Van Gogh.

Next week is Big Write week, when the children will become authors of their own imaginative story. They will continue to learn about halves and quarters in mathematics. In science, they will learn about the structure of trees and in art and design they will choose their favourite technique to create their final sunflower masterpiece.

Instead of a homework sheet, we would like to encourage you to practise sounding and blending unfamiliar words and reading silly alien words with your child. Here are some suggestions for phonics games. Perhaps you could play one a day with your child over the next fortnight:

- ***Be a phonics detective – see how many examples of one sound you can find.***
- ***Play a quiz – say a sound, can your child write it?***
- ***Turn the tables – let your child choose a sound for you to write!***
- ***Choose a real word that can be sounded out. Write the sounds on individual bits of paper and scatter them around the room. Can your child work out what your mystery word is by putting the sounds in the right order?***
- ***Choose a real word that can be sounded out and play 'hangman'.***
- ***Speak in code – say words by splitting them up into the sounds.***
- ***Say a sound – can your child find three things in the house with that sound?***

Year 2: What a fantastic week for the Year 2 children! On Wednesday, they were treated to one of the highlights of our school year – the Great Fire of London workshop, led by History Off the Page. The children were transported back to 1666 to experience life in London at that time. In the first part of the workshop, the children tried their hand at different jobs, including weaving, sewing, ink making, and candle making. They helped to be ratcatchers and apothecaries in the bustling London streets. In the second part of the workshop, the children learnt about the impact of the fire and became archaeologists, searching in the rubble for clues to work out who had lived in the area and what their life may have been like.



The children had a wonderful time, and it was lovely to see them dressed up in role for the day. Workshops like this really bring learning to life for the children. Evie said, "I took part by ringing the bell to collect money". Mila commented, "I wrote my name on leather, and it was really fun!" while Irina said, "I liked the part where I made my perfume as there were lots of different smelling flowers." Thank you to the parent volunteers who helped to make the day a success.

Following the workshop, the children learnt more about the Great Fire of London, sequencing the events of the fire and discovering how we know what happened. They also considered what life must have been like after the fire and the impact it had on the people of London. In mathematics, the children began to learn about fractions. They were introduced to parts and wholes and practised recognising equal and unequal parts. They learnt to recognise and find halves of shapes and amounts.

In art and design, the children used pastels and card silhouettes to create pictures of the London skyline during the Great Fire. In design and technology, they learnt what houses were made from in 1666 and designed their own house.

Next week is Big Write week, the theme of which is a surprise. In mathematics, the children will continue to learn about fractions, exploring quarters and thirds of shapes and amounts. In design and technology, they will create houses to recreate a street during the Great Fire of London. If you haven't already done so, please can you send in two small boxes, no bigger than 30cm.

We would like to say a big 'WELL DONE!' to all the Year 2 children for their hard work to learn the colours in Spanish. Thank you to everyone who sponsored them. Please return sponsorship money to your child's class teacher by Thursday 21st May.
