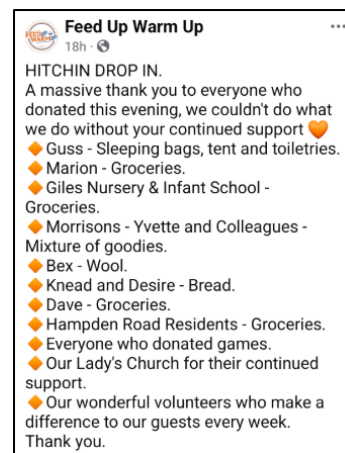

"My favourite book is *The Snail and the Whale* by Julia Donaldson. It's my favourite because I like whales!"

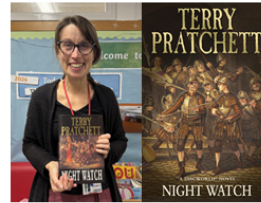

**Nursery:** *This week in Nursery, the children have continued to learn about the animals that live under the sea. The children have been playing 'guess who' when listening to clues given to describe a certain sea creature. The Ladybird children have been fantastic at listening and using their knowledge of sea creatures to identify a jellyfish, shark, crab and starfish. Jared proudly shared, "starfishes arms grow back you know."*

*In expressive arts and design, the children created their own 'under the sea' paintings using a variety of materials. They included sea creatures such as sea horses, sharks, puffer fish and crabs in their work. Isaac was proud to show his crab picture, saying, "I gave them faces, look. Crabs walk sideways."*

*In physical development, the children participated in a fantastic 'under the sea' yoga session. They quietly wiggled into a tunnel to find a seahorse, battled pirates and looked for treasure. Whilst on the adventure, they showed fantastic control and balance holding 'dolphin' and 'crab' pose.*

*In phonics, the children learnt the letter sound /n/ and practised saying 'nose', 'net', 'newt', 'nail' and many more. They also learnt the song, 'Hear the aeroplane, nnn, hear the aeroplane, nnn, hear the aeroplane, nnn, making lots of noise.'*

*After the half term break, the children will be taking part in Maths Week. They will measure sea creatures using non-standard units, explore capacity and practise forming numerals using number poems to help them.*

**Reception:** *This week, the children looked at how a windmill operates. When discussing what they already knew about windmills, Aiden in Barn Owl class said, "Windmills make electricity." In expressive arts and design, the children used a cylindrical tube to create a 3D windmill. They used a bradawl to pierce a hole through the cross of their windmill sails to enable them to attach them to the windmill tower. The children cut out a door and window from coloured paper and finished off by topping it with a cone shaped roof. To support their learning, they watched two short videos of how a windmill operates:*

*In mathematics, the children sorted 2D and 3D shapes according to their chosen criteria. For example, sorting according to colour. When sorting shapes, Bertie in Barn Owl class said, "I've sorted little with little and big with big."*

*This half term in PE, the children have pretended to be different modes of transport. This week they moved around the hall imagining to be a train. When Snowy Owls had finished their PE lesson, Josiah said, "I loved that lesson!"*

*After the half term break, the children will participate in Maths Week focusing on number bonds to ten. They will create calculations totalling ten using a special numbered rainbow and create number bonds using fingers on a pair of hands.*

*In addition, the children will be busy practising for their class assembly in preparation for presenting them the following week.*

***Year 1: This has been the most fabulously creative and imaginative Big Write week! The Year 1 children were astonished on Monday to discover that the Gruffalo had left them clues and a letter about the disappearance of Mouse. They promptly set about ensuring that Mouse would have a story to appear in! The children considered carefully where Mouse might have gone, who Mouse might have met, and what happened. They wrote their own story for Mouse, taking care to remember to use their best handwriting, sentence punctuation, finger spaces and adjectives. The Walker Bear children delighted in doing their very best to terrify Mrs Dalton with tales of haunted locations, abandoned places and creepy characters. Well done Year 1 and thank you to Miss Wright for such an inspired writing hook!***



***The children started to learn about position and direction in mathematics. They practised turning objects through quarter, half, three-quarter and full turns. They learnt an easy way to remember to identify left and right, by making an L shape with their thumb and forefinger on their left hand.***

***In art and design, the children made beautiful masterpieces of sunflowers. They looked at their experiments with collage, painting and printing from last week, before deciding how they would make their final artwork. The results really are wonderful.***

***In science, the children looked at the structure of trees and labelled parts of a tree.***

***We look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> June, for an exciting Maths Week! There will be no Forest School in the first week back. The children will begin their new cross-curricular topic all about the coast and seaside. In mathematics, they will be learning about place value within 100. If you would like to support your child to feel ready, please practise identifying tens and ones in a two-digit number, counting to 100 and backwards from 100, and counting in tens.***

***Please remember that the week beginning Monday 8<sup>th</sup> June is the national phonics screening week. Please avoid absence during that week if at all possible. Please encourage your child to keep reading through the holiday and playing some of the phonics games we suggested last week.***

***We hope you all have a wonderful bank holiday and half term week.***

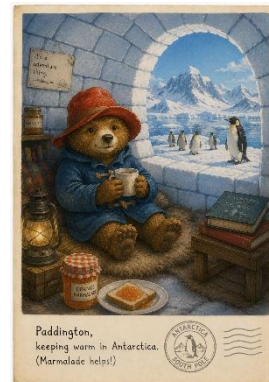

***Year 2:*** It has been a fantastic Big Write week in Year 2. On Monday, the children discovered that Paddington Bear had gone missing! They used their wonderful imaginations to think of places that Paddington may have visited, and the adventures he had. The children created adventure story plans before writing exciting adventure stories. We are so impressed with their independent writing and how much progress they have made this year. Well done, Year 2!



***In mathematics,*** the children continued to learn about fractions. They learnt how to recognise and find quarters and thirds of shapes and amounts. They also learnt how to find the whole when given a fraction of an amount. For example, if the whole has been split into two equal parts (halves) and each part contains three, then the whole is six.

***Following last week's Great Fire of London workshop,*** the children made houses like those in London in 1666. They used two cardboard boxes and decorated paper to show what they have learnt about the houses at that time and how their design intensified the spread of the fire. In art and design, the children looked at Claude Monet's 'Water Lilies' series of oil paintings before creating their own version with crayons and watercolours. In science, they explored living things in local habitats and how they depend on each other.

***After half term,*** the Year 2 children will continue their Nature Detectives topic. In English, they will learn to extend a story, using 'How to Catch a Star' by Oliver Jeffers as a stimulus for their writing. In mathematics, they will continue to learn about fractions and learn to tell the time. In science, the children will investigate different food chains. They will use Purple Mash to create digital artwork, and they will learn about rhythm in music. The children will begin a new PSHCE topic, Changing Me, where they will learn about growing from young to old and think about how they have changed since they were born. They will learn the physical differences between boys and girls, learn to use the correct names for the parts of the body and know that some parts of their body are private. If you have any questions or concerns about this element of our curriculum, please do not hesitate to speak with your child's class teacher.
