**Dear Parents/Carers,**

***The children have come back after a half-term with stunningly glorious weather and they all seem thoroughly refreshed and recharged. I hope you all enjoyed the beautiful sunshine as much as we did.***

***Our first week back has been a marvellous Maths Week and the children were astounded on Tuesday morning to receive a special video message from Captain Digit at Maths Headquarters, appealing for the help of Giles Nursery and Infants' School. Unfortunately, all her work was stolen by a supervillain on Monday night. Each day this week, she sent the children a different challenge that she had been investigating. The children worked in teams throughout the school to apply all their best mathematical and analytical skills to the task of helping her to recover the solutions. Captain Digit shared with the children a new clue each day that had been left behind by the somewhat careless supervillain for them to figure out who the treacherous individual was!***

***On Friday, all was resolved - the top-secret maths problems were restored to Captain Digit with their solutions and the supervillain was revealed - Gru! The children were rewarded for their efforts with a viewing of 'Minions - the Rise of Gru'. On Thursday, Professor Brainwave came to school and ran fascinating practical workshops throughout the day for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children. After school there was an opportunity for parents and children to flex their mathematical skills with Professor Brainwave's challenges. Thank you to Mrs Peace and Mrs Dalton, our inspirational maths leaders, for creating a truly inspirational and engaging Maths Week. Thank you also to Professor Brainwave from Brainwave Education.***

***Next week is going to be tremendously busy and exciting as children will engage in Planting Week. It is national Phonics Screening Check week and all children in Year 1 will be taking part in this statutory assessment, as well as some Year 2 children.***

**Nursery:** *The children have settled wonderfully this week and have been excited to take part in Maths Week, learning all about measuring. The children began the week exploring how to measure their peers using nonstandard units; for example, using building blocks and dice to discover how tall their peers are. During child-initiated learning time, the children measured toys, objects and even the dinosaurs using multilink cubes. Each key group then completed their own sunflower growth chart, measuring each child and adding their own leaf to their group sunflower. Novelle shared, "I am the tallest in Star Group!"*



*The children also explored capacity using different types of pasta and a variety of containers. Samuel stated, "Look, lots of pasta." Seth proudly shared, "Mine's full up Miss Edwards!"*



*In expressive arts and design, the children have been creating their own number collages using the number poems to help them. The Ladybird adults were very proud of the children's development as they used scissors safely and maintained focus throughout the activity. Well done, Ladybirds.*

***Reception:*** This week, the children have thoroughly enjoyed participating in a range of wonderful activities to celebrate Maths Week. In Reception, the theme for this year's Maths Week was number bonds to ten. Some of the activities the children have participated in have been singing a number bond song, calculating how many more passengers were needed to fill a minibus up to total ten and finding their number bond partner using Numicon.

The children have enjoyed using a numbered rainbow to calculate number bonds to ten, writing the calculations and creating number bonds to ten on a pair of hands and writing the calculation underneath each pair of hands.

The children have also helped the character Captain Digit solve a range of mathematical problems. One problem was linked to shape and when trying to solve the Mystery 2D Shape Puzzle, Kaitlin in Snowy Owl class said, "You have to match the shapes to solve it."

In phonics, the children have been introduced to blends. A blend is a combination of two or more consonants that are pronounced together while still allowing each sound to be heard; for example, 'nt' as in 'tent' or 'cr' as in 'cress'.

The children have been busy practising for their class assemblies next week and are looking forward to showing off their lovely pieces of artwork and singing some fantastic songs to you. The Reception assemblies are as follows:

If your child is in Barn Owl class, they will need to bring in a named baseball cap for their assembly on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> June as a prop for one of the songs.

Next week in literacy, the children will write factual sentences about a windmill. In mathematics, the children will focus on subtraction, pretending to be pirates stealing gold coins from their pirate partner and in understanding the world, the children will investigate the school grounds for signs of summer and use iPads to take photographs.

***Year 1: What an exciting start back to the final half term of the year! The children threw themselves into Maths Week, intrigued to help Captain Digit solve her maths problems and the mystery of who stole her top-secret work! They worked in small teams to apply their mathematical knowledge and used their oracy skills of active listening and building on the ideas of each other. On Thursday, they enjoyed Professor Brainwave's maths challenge workshops. Well done Year 1!***



***The children started their new cross-curricular topic all about seashores. They are writing their very own non-fiction book. This week, they researched rocky and sandy seashores. They learnt that Britain is an island and therefore has a lot of seashore! The children compared two coastal environments, Flamborough Head and Walton-on-the-Naze. The children were very motivated to learn about deciduous and evergreen trees in science. In history, they became detectives looking for clues in a picture to work out the identity of a famous person. Some children thought that the person might be a queen. Next week, they will find out if they were right. The children started their new PSHCE topic – Changing Me. The children will learn that we all change and grow and move on to new challenges and adventures. This week, they looked at lifecycles of butterflies and frogs and discussed how they change and grow at different stages of life.***

***Forest School will take place next week. In other learning, the children will continue to learn and write about coastal environments. In mathematics, they will begin learning about place value within 100. In PSHCE, the children will discuss how they have changed from babies to children and what they can do now. You might enjoy looking at some photos with your child and celebrating their personal journey of growth.***

***Next week is the national Phonics Screening Check week. Please avoid absence if at all possible. We will send homework and the new speaking and listening topic next Friday. Please continue to play phonic games and reading stories together this weekend.***

***Year 2: It has been a wonderful first week of the final half term of the year, with all the Year 2 children returning refreshed and ready to continue their learning.***



***The children have had a great time solving the three problems that Captain Digit sent them as part of Maths Week. Each class solved the problems with enthusiasm and used excellent oracy skills to work together in pairs, trios or small groups. The children learnt how to disagree politely, explain their thinking, and suggest ideas to initiate problem solving.***

***All the children were keen to solve the problems and discover the identity of the super villain who stole Captain Digit's work. Ivy in Puffin class shared, "I think the super villain is a monkey because monkeys like bananas!"***



***In English, the children explored the story, 'How to Catch a Star' by Oliver Jeffers. They created a story map to show the different ways the boy in the story tried to catch the star and came up with lots of ideas of how they might catch a star. Their ideas were very imaginative and included jumping on a trampoline, using a jet pack and bouncing on a pogo stick!***

***In science, the children learnt about food chains and used pictures of animals to create some examples. In music, the children learnt to sing 'The Sunshine Song'. In PSHCE, they explored and recognised lifecycles in nature, including a butterfly, a chicken and an oak tree.***

***Next week, the children will continue to explore the story 'How to Catch a Star' by Oliver Jeffers. They will write a diary entry as if they were the boy, write a book review and plan an extension to the story. In mathematics, they will finish the unit of work on fractions and begin a new unit focused on telling the time.***

***In science, the children will research how to look after a pet. In computing, they will look at the artwork of Piet Mondrian and create digital artwork in the same style. In PSHCE, they will identify the natural process of growing from young to old and understand that this is not something we can control.***

***Children who did not meet the threshold mark in the phonics screening check at the end of Year 1 will take the check again next week. If you have any questions about the check, please do not hesitate to speak with your child's class teacher.***
