Sports Day: Sports Day is on Tuesday 14th July. Please be prepared for cancellation in the event of the school field being too wet. We will text or send an email and put a message on the school website if a decision to cancel is taken in the morning. The reserve date will be Monday 20th July.

- **Dress:** Please dress children in their PE kits (polo shirts, shorts and training shoes) in the morning. They will need to wear a hat and sunscreen. Please supply your child with a water bottle.
- **Times of events:**
 - Reception: 9.05am - 10.00am
 - Year 1: 10.05am - 11.10am
 - Year 2: 11.15am - 12.20pm
- **Access to school field:** At 9.00am, the school caretaker will lock all external gates as usual except the Nursery entrance gate which will be kept open all morning. Please enter and exit the school premises through this gate. Please enter the sports field by walking along the Year 1 playground, then through the field gate.
- **Spectator rules:** We'll be marking off with barrier tape the spectator area which we would ask you to stay inside please. We will also have some chairs available.
 - Children must stay with their classes and not go with parents, for example, to use the toilet.
 - The event should be conducted in the same way as an assembly – families are there as spectators and should not approach the children, including at the end when they are walking back to class.
 - We did have incursions last year so please be aware that this year I will stop the races if any adults come outside of the allocated areas.

I know this is difficult and we understand that you're very proud of your children but this is a big event, and we need to keep all the children safe. This event taking place as it does on the sports field outside is the one time in the year when the school is not in control of who turns up to watch. We therefore have to make incredibly sure that we are keeping a clear gap between spectators and the children. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Todd in the Hole Festival: Children in Years 1 and 2 have received a separate letter about this event earlier this week. This incredible event is taking place from 3rd to 5th July this year. Our school will perform on Sunday 5th July and we are privileged in being the **ONLY** school to perform. We will be sending more information in due course but please speak to your child's class teacher as soon as possible to book your child's place. It is only to Year 1 and 2 children and all children will be given a free ticket for the day plus one free adult ticket. Further tickets can be purchased at a discount and we will provide you with the code when you confirm your child's place. Thank you everyone – it is truly an opportunity not to be missed!

Nursery: *This week, the children have loved continuing to learn all about the seaside. They learnt about different types of beaches and talked about sandy, pebbly and rocky shores. They looked at photographs of seaside places and shared their own experiences. During carpet time, the children joined in singing 'Row, Row, Row Your Boat' and paired up with friends to pretend they were rowing together in the sea. They showed great confidence as they used new vocabulary, such as 'cliff', 'pier' and 'harbour'.*

In mathematics, the children created their own tin foil boat and explored how many figures their boat could hold in the water. The children quickly discovered, the more figures they had in their boat, the heavier their boat became and the more likely it was to sink!



In phonics, the children have practised segmenting and blending. They are developing confidence using their 'robot arms' to segment a range of words including, 's-u-n', 's-o-ck' and 'l-o-g'. Please encourage your child to listen carefully to the sounds they can hear in short words.

In expressive arts and design, the children have been creative with a variety of seaside-themed activities. They enjoyed creating beach balls using collage materials as well as making colourful ice cream cones using tissue paper. The children also created their own boats using shapes and created a crab seaside picture using cupcake cases.

Next week in phonics, the children will consolidate their knowledge of the letter sounds learnt this term and continue to practise segmenting and blending. In PSHCE, they will remember some of the fun things about Nursery and look back at photographs from the year.

Reception: This week in understanding the world, the children made bread rolls. They took turns to mix the ingredients in the bowl, and each child was given a ball of dough to knead. When making bread rolls and kneading the dough, Dominik in Barn Owl class said, "At home with my mummy, she lets me knead the dough to make bread." After making bread, Aliyah in Tawny Owl class said, "My hands were covered in dough, I had to give them a jolly good wash!" The children took their rolls home at the end of the school day. The following morning, many said they enjoyed eating their roll for their tea.



In literacy, the children wrote a list of ingredients for making bread. The children found out the importance of yeast and because they did not know what yeast looked like, a sachet was opened for the children to investigate. Maeve in Barn Owl class said, "It looks a bit like brown powder."

Next week in literacy, the children will write sentences about the fillings they like in a sandwich. In understanding the world, the children will look at a map and discover breads from around the world. In this activity, they will use their sense of touch to feel the texture of the bread, their eyes to look at the colour and shape of the bread, their sense of smell, and of course, their sense of taste when sampling some! In mathematics, the children will create and continue a repeating pattern using multilink cubes. They will be challenged to create a more complex repeating pattern.

Year 1: It has been a somewhat exceptional week in Year 1. The children adapted incredibly well to changes to their normal routines and curriculum to cope with the unprecedented heatwave.

Thank you to all families for working with us to enable the children to showcase their learning in the Summer Concerts. The children work so hard to prepare for the concerts, not just learning lines, but also preparing themselves to perform in front of an audience. We are immensely impressed by the progress the children have made this year, socially and academically. We are sure your hearts must have been bursting with pride! Well done to all of Year 1.

In mathematics this week, the children learnt about money. They learnt to identify British coins and notes. They learnt to understand the value of the different coins and notes. The children worked hard to find ways to combine coins and notes to 'buy' different items. They used their skill of counting in twos, fives and tens to add together sets of coins.

In English, the children focussed on preparation for their concerts and speaking and listening presentations. They also began to look at the book 'Barnaby Bear at the Seaside'. They are using this text to find out about beach safety, including sun protection, safe swimming, and the role of the coastguards and RNLI.

Next week, the children will be formulating questions to ask about the RNLI and the work of coastguards and lifeguards. They will be practising writing questions using a question mark and a question word. They will complete their work on money in mathematics and begin their final mathematics topic of the year – telling the time. You might like to talk to your child about different types of clocks and your daily routine at home. In Year 1, the children learn to tell the time at o'clock and half-past.

The PSHCE lesson that was planned for this week will take place next week instead, to ensure all children take part. Children will learn to identify the parts of the body that make boys different to girls. They will learn the correct scientific name for these parts: penis, testicles, vagina, vulva and anus. This is part of the safeguarding duty of the school as well as the PSHCE curriculum.

As we near the end of the year, please may we ask you to consider donating your child's Forest School puddle suit, waterproofs or welly boots to us? It is most helpful to have spares. Our last Forest School sessions will take place in the week of 6th July.

There is a new homework sheet – the last one of the year! The theme is money.

Stars of the week:

All the Year 1 children for working so hard throughout the year to make fantastic progress and to prepare your summer concerts.

Year 2: What a hot week it has been! Well done to the Year 2 children for staying focused and being understanding of the adaptations in school. Thank you to parents and carers for your support and understanding.

In English this week, the children started to learn the traditional African folktale, 'The Papaya That Spoke'. The children listened to the story several times and carefully watched the actions that accompany it. They rehearsed telling the story themselves and they are doing a wonderful job of learning it by heart. The children also practised writing descriptive sentences, including similes.

In mathematics, the children learnt about statistics. They learnt how to record data using a tally chart and thought about when it would be easier to use a table. They learnt how to interpret data in a block graph and created their own graphs using given data.

In English next week, the children will choose characters and settings to write their own version of 'The Papaya That Spoke'. In mathematics, they will continue to learn about statistics. In design and technology, the children will learn how to sew using running stitch.

The PSHCE lesson that was planned for this week will take place next week instead, to ensure all children take part. The children will learn to recognise the physical differences between boys and girls and use the correct names for parts of the body, including the vocabulary 'penis', 'testicles', 'vagina', 'breasts' and 'anus'. This forms part of our science and PSHCE curriculum and supports safeguarding of our children. If you have concerns or would like to discuss this in more detail, please speak to your child's class teacher.

On Tuesday, the children will be visited in their classrooms by their new Year 3 teachers from the Junior School. On Thursday, the teachers will visit again and teach the classes. On Wednesday, the Year 2 children will visit Woburn Safari Park. A checklist of information will be sent home with your child next week. School is closed on Friday for an Inset Day.
