Dear Parents/Carers,

The Grand Finale of this momentous week is today with the beyond fabulous Nursery Pirate Day – one of the key events of the year! It's astonishing how often Year 2 children in their leavers' assemblies say that this event was their most memorable and loved of their entire time in the school! Our truly tremendous Nursery team work so hard to prepare for the day including a vast range of exciting activities. We are so very, very grateful to them. What a week!

End of Year Attainment: *We are thrilled to be able to share with you our phenomenal results in the statutory phonics screening check. 80.9% of our children passed the phonics screening check in Year 1, compared to last year's national average of 80% and 92% of our Year 2 children will move to junior school having passed the check.*

Summer Fair Poster Competition Winners: *Thank you to all the children who entered the competition to design a poster for the FROG Summer Fair. School Council initiated the competition and selected the winning posters this week. Congratulations to Lyra in Tawny Owl class, Sabin in Walker Bear class, Afna in Penguin class and Ria in Orca class! Well done to School Council for thinking carefully about the entries and taking a vote on which they felt were most eye-catching, creative and informative.*



Year 1 and Year 2 Enterprise Stalls at Summer Fair: *As part of Money Week, the School Council challenged children in Years 1 and 2 to suggest ideas for stalls to help raise money for the school. Each class was given £10 to invest. The classes in both year groups decided to pool their investment pots and work together. The Year 2 stall had a literary theme with special bookmarks decorated by the children. The Year 1 stall sold balloons and football themed snap bands. Congratulations to both year groups for raising enough money to cover the initial investment and generate additional funds for our wonderful FROG.*

Well done to the children for making posters to show the prices and decorate the stalls, for helping to set up and for assisting with selling the products. Thank you to

Sports Day: *Sports Day is on Tuesday 14th July. Please be prepared for cancellation in the event of the school field being too wet. We will text or send an email and put a message on the school website if a decision to cancel is taken in the morning. The reserve date will be Monday 20th July.*

- **Dress:** *Please dress children in their PE kits (polo shirts, shorts and training shoes) in the morning. They will need to wear a hat and sunscreen. Please supply your child with a water bottle.*

- **Access to school field:** *At 9.00am, the school caretaker will lock all external gates as usual except the Nursery entrance gate which will be kept open all morning. Please enter and exit the school premises through this gate. Please enter the sports field by walking along the Year 1 playground, then through the field gate.*
- **Spectator rules:** *We'll be marking off with barrier tape the spectator area which we would ask you to stay inside please. We will also have some chairs available.*
 - *Children must stay with their classes and not go with parents, for example, to use the toilet.*
 - *The event should be conducted in the same way as an assembly – families are there as spectators and should not approach the children, including at the end when they are walking back to class.*
 - *We did have incursions last year so please be aware that this year I will stop the races if any adults come outside of the allocated areas.*

I know this is difficult and we understand that you're very proud of your children but this is a big event, and we need to keep all the children safe. This event taking place as it does on the sports field outside is the one time in the year when the school is not in control of who turns up to watch. We therefore have to make incredibly sure that we are keeping a clear gap between spectators and the children. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

We ask our families to share this information with friends and family where they have a child due to start Nursery in September 2026. Eligible children will have birth dates between 1st September 2022 and 31st August 2023.*

"*Funnybones* is my favourite because it has a ghost in it. The ghost catches up with the big skeleton and takes off his hat and that makes me laugh!"

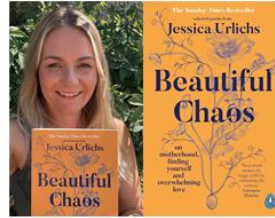

Nursery: This week, the children continued to count down to Pirate Day. They listened to lots of pirate stories and loved singing pirate songs with their friends. The children made bunting to decorate the Nursery and even created their very own pirates using their fabulous cutting skills to dress them with hats, t-shirts, shorts and bandanas.

In physical development, the children enjoyed pretending to 'walk the plank' in the garden with their friends. They loved taking part in a Cosmic Yoga session and thoroughly enjoyed an adventure with 'Popcorn the Dolphin'. Each group were excited to hold their hands together, move up and down and click like a dolphin as they swam to the smuggler's cave to find the treasure.

In phonics, the children revisited the letter sounds they have learnt this year. They confidently shared objects that started with the sounds /s/, /a/, /t/, /p/, /i/ and /n/. The children consolidated their understanding of alliteration and thought of two or more words that start with the same sound.

The children went to visit their Reception classes on Thursday and did incredibly well adjusting to the change of spending time in their new classes and meeting their new adults.

On Friday, everyone had a fantastic time at Pirate Day! The children were eager to get involved with the pirate themed activities and looked amazing in their pirate costumes. They all went home with a wonderful collection of art and craft activities, including treasure maps, medallions, parrots, pirate hats and telescopes. The children sailed the seven seas in the pirate ship and bravely walked the plank! They decorated and ate a biscuit and even took some popcorn home too! It was a wonderful day enjoyed by everyone. Thank you to all the parents and carers for braving the heat!

Reception: This week in understanding the world, the children found out how the harvesting of wheat has changed over the years and created a pictorial timeline. They watched a man using a scythe, a film clip from 1938 of a combine harvester being pulled by at least a dozen horses and a film of a modern combine harvester cutting the crops and dispensing the wheat into a tractor trailer. During child-initiated learning, Ben in Barn Owl class made a combine harvester using Duplo and when showing his model, he said, "This green bit is the arm where the wheat comes out and fills the trailer that's attached to the tractor."



In a second understanding the world activity, the children ventured outside and used fine brushes to paint a tree in summer bloom. The children's 'Seasons' book is now complete and will be passed on to their Year 1 teacher.

In mathematics, the children used wooden blocks to create mazes for their partner to solve. They loved watching the story 'The Secret Path' by Nick Butterworth, where Percy the Park Keeper and his animals friends get lost in the park maze but are rescued by a hedgehog. Each child enjoyed the challenge of taking a small world character through their partner's maze to find a gold coin.

The children thoroughly enjoyed making a sandwich and choosing a filling of their choice. They were able to choose from honey, strawberry jam, or cheese spread. The children followed a set of instructions with the final instruction of eating their sandwich!

Next week in literacy, the children will be writing sentences about what actions they can do in PE. In understanding the world, the children will listen to the story 'Noah's Ark' and use the app Sketchbook on the iPad to create a rainbow. They will also make a rainbow using half a paper plate. The children will make a class book of Noah's Ark which will be displayed in their Year 1 class for them to read at any time.

Next week, we will be collecting library books in. Please would you make sure any library books your child has borrowed are in their book bag for us to collect.

Year 1: In English this week, the children have researched different types of RNLI lifeboat and written fact files about them. They applied all their learning about full stops, capital letters and finger spaces to write super sentences. Many children wrote a sequence of facts. The children were fascinated to watch videos of lifeboats launching and at sea, and to find out about the valuable lifesaving work of the RNLI and the volunteers who carry out the rescues.

The children finished their unit of learning about time in mathematics. They learnt to tell the time to 'o'clock' and 'half past the hour'. They also learnt about the days of the week, months of the year and seconds, minutes and hours.

In phonics, the children learnt about alternative spellings for the sounds /z/, /w/, /f/, and /ow/. They were excited to see that they already knew many alternatives from their phonics learning.

The children were keen to start to learn about joining letters in handwriting. They began with the digraph 'ch'.

The children had a wonderful time in their final Forest School session of Year 1. These sessions have been magical and a real opportunity for the children to safely take risks and to challenge themselves, as well as learn to collaborate with peers. We hope you have enjoyed hearing about Forest School, if not washing out all the mud!

In geography, the children drew wonderful aerial view maps of the Forest School area. In PE, the children practised Sports Day races, sportsmanship and cheering on their teams.

Finally, we were so proud of the children on their Moving Up Day on Thursday. The opportunity to spend some time with their new teachers in their new classrooms is so valuable and they came back to their Year 1 teachers with lots of information!

Next week, the children will write a recount of their trip to Shepreth Wildlife Park. Please chat with your child over the weekend about their memories of that special day. In mathematics, they will consolidate learning from this year. On Monday, please send your child to school wearing something white for the Glow Dance Workshop. On Friday, the children will have an amazing workshop on the history of holidays by the sea. Please send your child to school in seaside clothes on Friday.

***Year 2:** This week, the children enjoyed two transition sessions at Giles Junior School. On Tuesday afternoon, they visited their new classrooms, asked the current Year 3 children lots of questions and explored their new playground. On Thursday morning, they spent time with their new teachers and completed an 'all about me' activity.*

In English, the children used their story plans to write their own version of 'The Papaya That Spoke'. In mathematics, they learnt to use the language of position, such as 'above', 'below' and 'between'. They also learnt to use the language of movement, such as 'forwards', 'backwards', 'left' and 'right'. They also learnt to describe turns.

Next week is One World Week. The children will take part in two special activities – the Glow Dance Workshop postponed from this week and a Chinese Dragon Workshop.

In class, the children will read the book 'My Granny Went to Market' and learn about some of the countries Granny visits on her magic carpet.

Sports Day takes place on Tuesday next week, with the Year 2 races starting at 10.35am. Please can children come to school in their PE kit and have a fresh bottle of water with them.

End of year reports will be sent home next week, and we will start to send home your child's workbooks next Friday. Please send in a couple of sturdy plastic bags as the books are very heavy.
